


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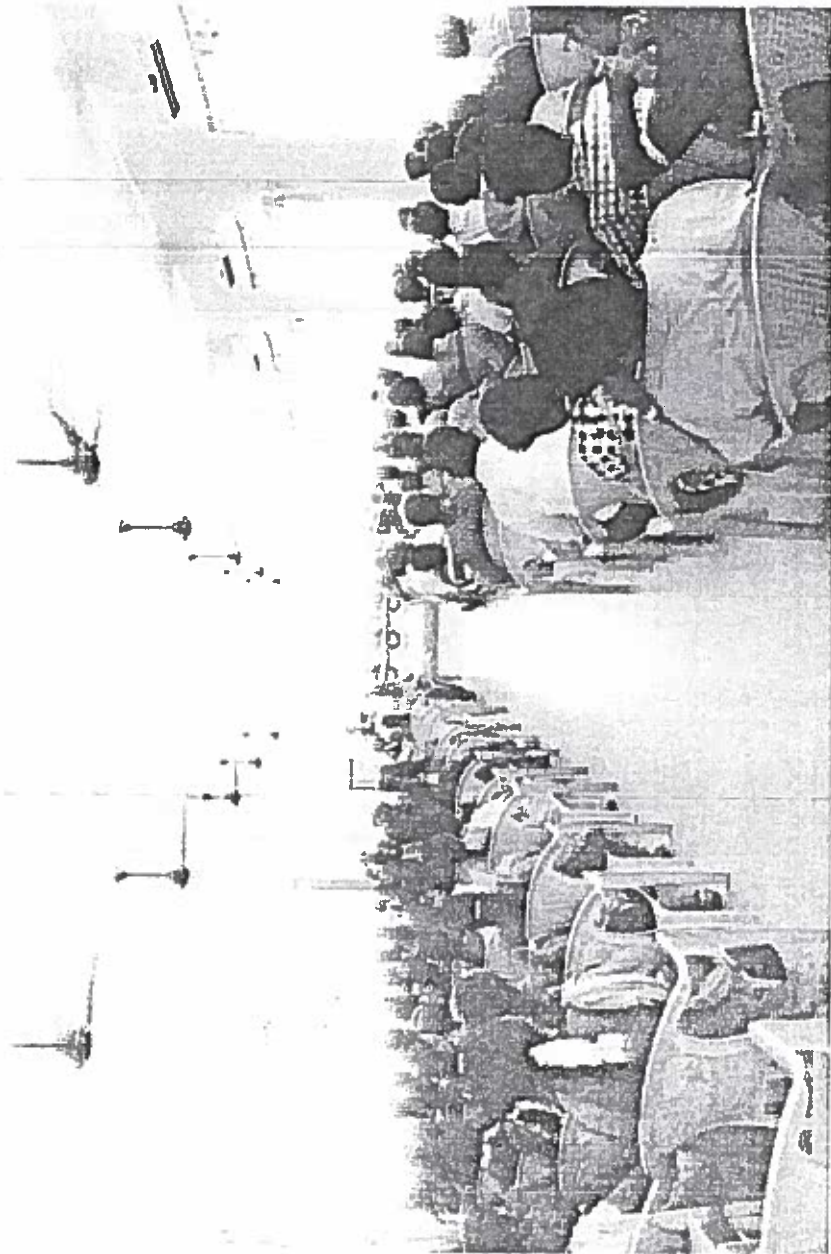

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REPORT FOR "SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY"

Date: 17/7/2015


This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 17/07/2015 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed principal Dr.Govardhan in ECE seminar hall at 10.30AM

Dr. A.Swarna, Associate professor,CSE dept,VJIT, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure "SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY"

He expressed that Numerous controversies and debates have taken place throughout the history of psychopathology (and its main classification systems) with regards to sexual orientation and gender identity. These are still reflected on present reformulations of gender dysphoria in both the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual and the International Classification of Diseases, and in more or less subtle micro-aggressions experienced by lesbian, gay, bisexual and *trans* patients in mental health care.

It's a common misconception that gender identity and sexual orientation are connected. If someone is transgender, for example, many people automatically assume that they must also be gay. That, however, is not the case. Gender and sexuality are different, and it's an important distinction to understand. Gender identity is defined by the Human Rights Campaign as the "innermost concept of self as male, female, a blend of both or neither – how individuals perceive themselves and what they call themselves." It can mirror what a person was assigned at birth, or be entirely different. There are dozens of genders, outside of just man or woman, that people can identify with.

Controversies and debates with regards to medical classification of sexual orientation and gender identity contribute to the reflection on the very concept of mental illness. The agreement that mental disorders cause subjective distress or are associated with impairment in social functioning was essential for the removal of "homosexuality" from the DSM in the 1970s. Moreover,


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(trans)gender diagnoses constitute a significant dividing line both within *trans* related activism and the health professionals' communities. The discussion has taken place between two apposite positions: (1) trans(gender) diagnoses should be removed from health classifying systems, because they promote the pathologization and stigmatization of gender diversity and enhance the medical control of *trans* people's identities and lives; and (2) trans(gender) diagnoses should be retained in order to ensure access to care, since health care systems rely on diagnoses to justify medical treatment – which many *trans* people need. In fact, *trans* people often describe experiences of severe distress and argue for the need for treatments and access to medical care, but at the same time reject the label of mental illness for themselves. Thus, it may be important to understand how the debate around (trans)diagnoses may be driven also by a history of undue gatekeeping and by stigma involving mental illness.


This seminar states that sexual orientation and gender identity have been viewed, in the history of the field of psychopathology, between two poles: gender transgression and gender variance/fluidity.

On the one hand, aligned with a position of “transgression” and/or “deviation from a norm,” people who today are described as LGBT were labeled as mentally ill. Inevitably, classification systems reflect the existing social attitudes and prejudices, as well as the historical and cultural contexts in which they were developed. In that, they often failed to differentiate between mental illness and socially non-conforming behavior or fluidity of gender expressions. This position and the historical roots of this discourse are still reflected in the practices of some clinicians, ranging from “conversion” therapies to micro-aggressions in the daily lives of LGBT people, including those experienced in the care by mental health professionals. On the other hand, lined up with a position of gender variance and fluidity, changes in the diagnostic systems in the last few decades reflect a broader respect and value of the diversity of human sexuality and of gender expressions. This position recognizes that the discourse and practices coming from the (mental) health field may lead to changes in the broader cultural beliefs. As such, it also recognizes the power of medical classifications, health discourses and clinical practices in translating the responsibility of fighting discrimination and promoting LGBT people's well-being.

In conclusion, it seems crucial to emphasize the role of specific training and supervision in the development of clinical competence in the work with sexual minorities. Several authors have

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argued for the importance of continuous education and training of practitioners in individual and cultural diversity competences, across professional development. This is in line with APA's ethical guidelines, and it is even more relevant when we acknowledge the significant and recent changes in this field. Furthermore, it is founded on the very notion that LGBT competence assumes clinicians ought to be aware of their own personal values, attitudes and beliefs regarding human sexuality and gender diversity in order to provide appropriate care. These ethical concerns, however, have not been translated into training programs in medicine and psychology in a systematic manner in most European countries, and to the mainstreaming of LGBT issues in psychopathology.

REPORT FOR "ISSUES MODERN FEMINISM FACES"

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 30/7/2015 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed principal Dr.Govardhan in ECE seminar hall at 02.00PM

Dr. S.B. Dwarakanath, Prof., Dept. of LAW, Osmania University, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure "ISSUES MODERN FEMINISM FACES".

Women are involved in all parts of society, but some matters affect and touch women more than others. From the power of the women's vote to reproductive rights and the pay gap.

Few of the major issues that modern women face:

SEXISM AND GENDER BIAS

The "glass ceiling" is a popular phrase that women have been striving to break through for decades. It refers to gender equality, primarily in the workforce, and great progress has been made over the years. It is no longer uncommon for women to run businesses, even the biggest corporations, or hold job titles in the upper ranks of management. Many women also do jobs that are traditionally male-dominated.

For all the progress that has been made, sexism can still be found. It may be more subtle than it once was, but it makes an appearance in all parts of society, from education and the workforce to the media and politics.


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THE POWER OF THE WOMEN'S VOTE

Women do not take the right to vote lightly. It can be surprising to learn that in recent elections, more American women have voted than men.

Voter turnout is a big deal during elections and women do tend to have a better turnout than men. This is true of all ethnicities and all age groups in both presidential election years and midterm elections. The tide turned in the 1980s and it has not shown signs of slowing down.

THE CYCLE OF THE DOMESTIC ABUSE

Domestic violence is another top concern for women, though this issue affects men as well. It's estimated that 1.3 million women and 835,000 men are physically assaulted by their partners each year. Even teen dating violence is more prevalent than many would hope to admit.

Abuse and violence do not come in a single form, either. From emotional and psychological abuse to sexual and physical abuse, this continues to be a growing problem.

Domestic violence can happen to anyone, yet the most important thing is to ask for help. There are many myths surrounding this issue and one incident can lead to a cycle of abuse.

Feminism is a range of political movements, ideologies, and social movements that share a common goal: to define, establish, and achieve political, economic, personal, and social rights for women that are equal to those of men. This includes seeking to establish equal opportunities for women in education and employment. Feminist movements have campaigned and continue to campaign for women's rights, including the right to vote, to hold public office, to work, to earn fair wages or equal pay, to own property, to receive education, to enter contracts, to have equal rights within marriage, and to have maternity leave. Feminists have also worked to promote bodily autonomy and integrity, and to protect women and girls from rape, sexual harassment, and domestic violence. Feminist campaigns are generally considered to be one of the main forces behind major historical societal changes for women's rights, particularly in the West, where they are near-universally credited with having achieved women's suffrage, gender neutrality in English, reproductive rights for women (including access to contraceptives and abortion), and the right to enter into contracts and own property. Although feminist advocacy is, and has been,


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mainly focused on women's rights, some feminists, including bell hooks, argue for the inclusion of men's liberation within its aims because men are also harmed by traditional gender roles. Feminist theory, which emerged from feminist movements, aims to understand the nature of gender inequality by examining women's social roles and lived experience; it has developed theories in a variety of disciplines in order to respond to issues concerning gender. Numerous feminist movements and ideologies have developed over the years and represent different viewpoints and aims. Some forms of feminism have been criticized for taking into account only white, middle class, and educated perspectives. This criticism led to the creation of ethnically specific or multicultural forms of feminism, including black feminism and intersectional feminism.

Dr. Dr. M.Sreevani, Associate Professor, CSE Dept, MGIT, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “COMPARE THEORIES OF GENDER DEVELOPMENT”.

Human differentiation on the basis of gender is a fundamental phenomenon that affects virtually every aspect of people's daily lives. This article presents the social cognitive theory of gender-role development and functioning. It specifies how gender conceptions are constructed from the complex mix of experiences and how they operate in concert with motivational and self-regulatory mechanisms to guide gender-linked conduct throughout the life course. The theory integrates psychological and sociostructural determinants within a unified conceptual structure. In this theoretical perspective, gender conceptions and roles are the product of a broad network of social influences operating interdependently in a variety of societal subsystems. Human evolution provides bodily structures and biological potentialities that permit a range of possibilities rather than dictate a fixed type of gender differentiation. People contribute to their self-development and bring about social changes that define and structure gender relationships through their agentic actions within the interrelated systems of influence.

She expressed that the Interdependence of Gender Socializing Subsystems has the influential role played by each of the various societal subsystems in the differentiation of gender attributes and roles. In social cognitive theory, human development and functioning are highly socially interdependent, richly contextualized and conditionally manifested. In everyday life these different subsystem sources of influence operate interdependently rather than isolatedly. The


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multicausality and reciprocity of influences adds greatly to the complexity of disentangling functional dependencies and their changing dynamics over the course of development. Further progress in understanding the sources, social functions, and personal and social effects of gender differentiation will require greater effort to clarify the complex interplay of the various subsystems of influence within the larger societal context. However, people are not simply the products of social forces acting upon them. In the triadic reciprocity posited by social cognitive theory, people contribute to their self-development and social change through their agentic actions within the interrelated systems of influence.





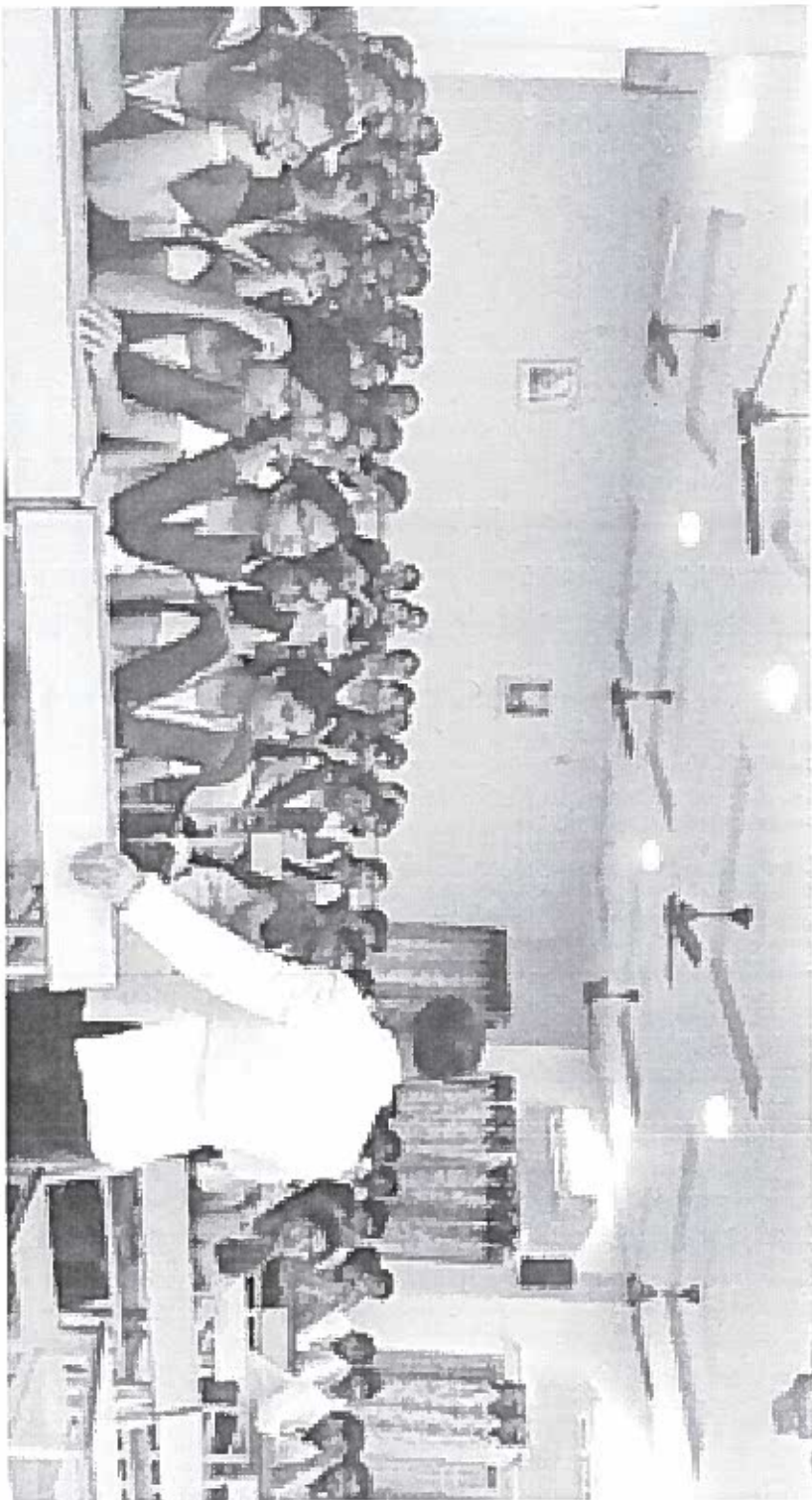

REPORT FOR “GENDER STEREOTYPES IN SCIENCE AND EDCUATION”

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 28/8/2015 faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Govardhan in Seminar hall at 11.30AM.

Dr. Ch. Venkata Ramana Devi, Prof. Dept of Biochemistry, Osmania University, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on “GENDER STEREOTYPES IN SCIENCE AND EDCUATION ”.

She expressed that more men are studying and working in science fields than women. This could be an effect of the prevalence of gender stereotypes (e.g., science is for men, not for women). Aside from the media and people's social lives, such stereotypes can also occur in education. Ways in which stereotypes are visible in education include the use of gender-biased visuals, language, teaching methods, and teachers' attitudes. The goal of this study was to determine whether science education resources for primary school contained gender-biased visuals. Specifically, the total number of men and women depicted, and the profession and activity of each person in the visuals were noted. The analysis showed that there were more men than women depicted with a science profession and that more women than men were depicted as teachers. This study shows that there is a stereotypical representation of men and women in online science education resources, highlighting the changes needed to create a balanced representation of men and women. Even if the stereotypical representation of men and women in science is a true reflection of the gender distribution in science, we should aim for a more balanced representation. Such a balance is an essential first step towards showing children that


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both men and women can do science, which will contribute to more gender-balanced science and technology fields.

In order to counteract gender stereotypes in science education resources, it is important that the number of men and women in the visual content of educational resources is balanced, as well as the number of boys and girls. In this manner, girls can see that science is for women as well as for men. In addition, the type of professions and activities of men and women should be portrayed equally, as well as that of boys and girls. Related to this is to balance the number of people mentioned in texts, with regard to gender. In this way, stories in science education resources about boy characters and girl characters will be balanced. Another important way to counteract gender stereotypes in science education resources is by using gender-balanced language.

Future research should explore whether there are any differences between different science fields (e.g., astronomy, biology, chemistry, geology, mathematics, physics, and technology) with regard to the gender distribution for professions and activities in education resources. Since the distribution of men and women is different in different science fields], it can be expected that science education resources from the fields where there are many more men than women show a bigger gender imbalance than those of science fields where there is an equal distribution of men and women. Testing this will, therefore, offer two main insights: 1) which fields need to do much work to achieve more gender-balanced education resources about those science fields and 2) which fields already have relatively gender-neutral education resources. It is expected that resources about biology, for example, are less gender-biased than those about physics or astronomy.

In conclusion, we found that in the studied online science education resources, women and men are portrayed in stereotypic ways, with more men depicted with science professions and more women depicted as teachers. Even if this is a true reflection of the distribution of men and women in those professions, we should aim for a more balanced representation so girls and boys see examples of both female and male scientists. We believe that a more balanced view will help girls and boys to make their own decisions concerning their studies and professions rather than those decisions being influenced by gender stereotypes.

**REPORT FOR “GENDER SENSITIZATION FOR STRENGTHENING WOMEN
PERSPECTIVE IN AGRICULTURE”**

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 03/10/2015 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Govardhan in ECE seminar hall at 11.00AM Dr. A.Nagesh, HOD, CSE Dept, VJIT,Hyderabad.

was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “GENDER SENSITIZATION FOR STRENGTHENING WOMEN PERSPECTIVE IN AGRICULTURE”.

Women have been contributing enormously to agricultural growth and development through their involvement in crop production, horticulture, animal husbandry, fisheries, natural resource management etc. Though the proportion of women workers in agriculture has declined, yet they constitute a significant workforce in agriculture. Globally, they constitute about 42% of economically active population in agriculture. Region-wise figures show that agriculture supports a very high proportion of economically active women, particularly in Asia and Africa and in India, it is about 62%. Women’s contribution varies across regions, sociocultural and agro-production systems. On the other hand, the persisting gender gap in access to and control of resources remains an important concern which has not only kept women in a vicious circle of low productivity but also has thrown up questions about inclusive and sustainable growth of the sector. Today, how to bridge the gender gap and empower women with new knowledge and technology is a great challenge, particularly in the context of socioeconomic and climate related



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changes. Importantly, our approach to research, extension and development have not been gender sensitive and there is a general reluctance on part of a large section of researchers, extension and developmental workers to include gender component in programmes. While at global level there has been a lot of concern and action on empowerment of women in agriculture, efforts in India has been slow on this front.

Considering the above, the seminar on 'Gender Sensitisation for Strengthening Women Perspective in Agriculture' was organized to develop the competency of development and extension professionals in strengthening gender component in their development & extension programmes. The material was designed keeping in view the requirements of the participants with different backgrounds. The contents included issues related to women in agriculture in various domains of extension & Development, methodologies for strengthening gender perspective in interventions, gender and data analysis, monitoring and evaluation of gender based R&D projects. All these were compiled to develop this Compendium which, we hope, will be useful for agricultural R&D stakeholders.

She addressed particularly that the issues of women in agriculture for farm mechanization and to reduce their drudgery with increased output researches are carried with the aim to frame strategies for reducing drudgery of farm women to fabricate and disseminate the available drudgery reducing farm tools and equipment to stake holders. In order to demonstrate the output and utilities of gender research, strong partnerships with ICAR institutions, Gender Sensitisation for Strengthening Women Perspective in Agriculture, development agencies, NGOs and international organizations would be worked out in future. Efforts for gender mainstreaming are required to bring social, cultural and attitudinal changes which not only strive for ending the invisibility of women's contribution to agriculture, but of eliminating the drudgery that blights the lives of millions of working women in India. It is important to recognize that women's empowerment through technologies can raise their status only through a meaningful stimulation. There is therefore, needed to have the participation of women at every level in decision making, program formulation and implementation.

Charitra’ which means character is the most delicate and sensitive aspect of women’s dignity or self worth. Unfortunately, the same is at a high risk these days because of external threat as well as internal weakness which might lead one to become promiscuous. And in such cases, not just the woman but her whole family suffers a big loss. Identifying the root cause of such downfall. DJJS Santulan designed a grooming workshop for women and girls in order to develop their personalities to the core of their existence, nourishing trans body aspects – mind, intellect and soul. As only by meeting ones complete existential personality can she overcome behavioral and emotional fluxes received from family, friends or workplace.

**REPORT FOR “CAUSES OF SEX DIFFERENCES AND
SIMILARITIES IN BEHAVIOUR”**

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 24/11/2015 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Govardhan in seminar hall at 02.30PM

Dr. Kavitha Waghray, HOD, Pharmacy Dept,OU, Hyderabad was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on **“CAUSES OF SEX DIFFERENCES AND SIMILARITIES IN BEHAVIOUR”**.

She expressed that What are the causes of sex differences and similarities in behavior? Some causes can be traced to human evolutionary history, especially the ways that the division of labor is influenced by biology and environments. A human universal--in all known societies--is a division of tasks so that men do some things in society and women do others. The specific activities in a society depend on what tasks can be performed most efficiently by each sex, given men's greater size, strength, and speed and women's bearing and nursing children.

The division of labor structures psychological sex differences and similarities. By observing the activities of women and men in their society, people form gender role beliefs or sex-typed expectations. For example, given that women perform more childcare than men in most industrialized societies, women are believed to be especially nurturant and caring. Given that men are more likely than women to hold higher status jobs in industrialized societies, men are believed to be especially dominant and assertive. Gender roles then influence behavior through social and biological processes. In social interaction, people respond more favorably to others


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who conform to gender role expectations. Women and men also might incorporate gender roles into their own personal identities. Additionally, hormonal processes support role performance. Females enjoy a general advantage in communication skills, both in the verbal domain and in the production and decoding of nonverbal displays. The higher expressiveness of females is reflected in a higher frequency of both smiling and crying; gender differences in crying are especially robust and tend to increase in more gender egalitarian countries. Consistent with the data on personality and social relations males tend to use more assertive speech and interrupt their conversation partners. However gender differences in language use are highly dependent on contextual factors, testifying to the remarkable strategies flexibility of human communication.

REPORT FOR “LADIKI KA SWADHAR”

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 27/12/2014 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed principal Dr.Govardhan in seminar hall at 11.30AM.

Dr. Ch. Venkata Ramana Devi, Associate Professor, Sphoorthy Engineering college Hyderabad, Was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “LADIKI KA SWADHAR”.

She stressed particularly awareness amongst young female workers about their employment opportunities and career possibilities, family building and the work family Balance

The position of women in politics is weak, though at top level there were and are remarkable exceptions. With the 2009 elections, women representation in the lower house of parliament increased to 11%. In recent years many women have been confronted with domestic violence and sexual harassment.

The global economic crisis has had a rather modest impact on India's economy, and the prospects for the country's rebound seem bright. Yet, in 2008-09 the decline in manufacturing exports has caused serious problems for in particular women.

Telephone use is rapidly switching from fixed line to cellular phone networks. In 2009, already 365 of each 1,000 in the population used a cell phone. Internet coverage is growing but still low, with one in 12 surfing on the Internet. Television is a popular medium: over half of all households have a TV set. Cable TV proves to have emancipator force, especially for rural women.

India has ratified only four of eight core ILO Labour Conventions. In practice workers' rights are only legally protected for the small minority working in the organized sector. Even formally the freedom of association is limited. Strikes are prohibited in the public sector.

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On average the female share in membership and decision-making remains low. In contrast, strongholds of female organizing have emerged as responses to problems in informal labour

The female shares of graduated were higher than the male shares in banking and finance real estate and business services, and transport. Among the 15-29 of age, the gender gap was considerably smaller.

It is found that acceptance of unequal gender norms by women are still prevailing in the society. More than half of the women believe wife beating to be justified for one reason or the other. Fewer women have final say on how to spend their earnings. Control over cash earnings increases with age, education and with place of residence. Women's exposure to media is also less relative to men.

Rural women are more prone to domestic violence than that of urban women. A large gender gap exists in political participation too. The study concludes by an observation that access to education and employment are only the enabling factors to empowerment, achievement towards the goal, however, depends largely on the attitude of the people towards gender equality.

Dr. M.Ramabai, Professor in CSE Department, Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Technology was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “Empowering women through gender sensitization”.

Gender sensitization refers to the modification of behavior by raising awareness of gender equality concerns. This can be achieved by conducting various sensitization campaigns, workshop, programs etc. Gender sensitization refers to theories which claim that modification of the behavior of teachers and parents (etc.) towards children can have a causal effect on gender equality. Gender sensitizing is about changing behavior and instilling empathy into the views that we hold about our own and the other sex." It helps people in "examining their personal attitudes and beliefs and questioning the 'realities they thought they know."

Gender sensitization makes people more sensitive towards the problem of women and so they tend to think about different reforms required to raise the status of women by empowering them . It initiates Policy makers to address gender related issues as a priority as gender bias hinders in attaining an equitable social and economic order.

According to the Country Report of the Government of India, “Empowerment means moving from a weak position to execute a power.” Education of women is the most powerful tool of

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change of position in society. Education also brings a reduction in inequalities and functions as a means of improving their status within the family. To encourage the education of women at all levels and for dilution of gender bias in providing knowledge and education, established schools, colleges and universities play important role.

She stressed particularly to provide a critical perspective on the socialization of men and women. Gender inequality is a long-term problem in our society and female are discriminated in many ways in the social context of India, although legally women have equal right. Thus, there is a great need to sensitize the society on gender issues so that there would be no discrimination on the basis of gender. Women empowerment through gender sensitization is one of the key criteria to unlock the potential of women. This seminar builds on the experiences she faced and explains the importance of gender sensitization in educational institutions to deal with various gender related issues. It also describes strategies to be adopted in schools to promote gender sensitization. This seminar will be useful to take a closer look at strengthening mechanisms which will ensure women's full and equal participation in decision making at all levels.

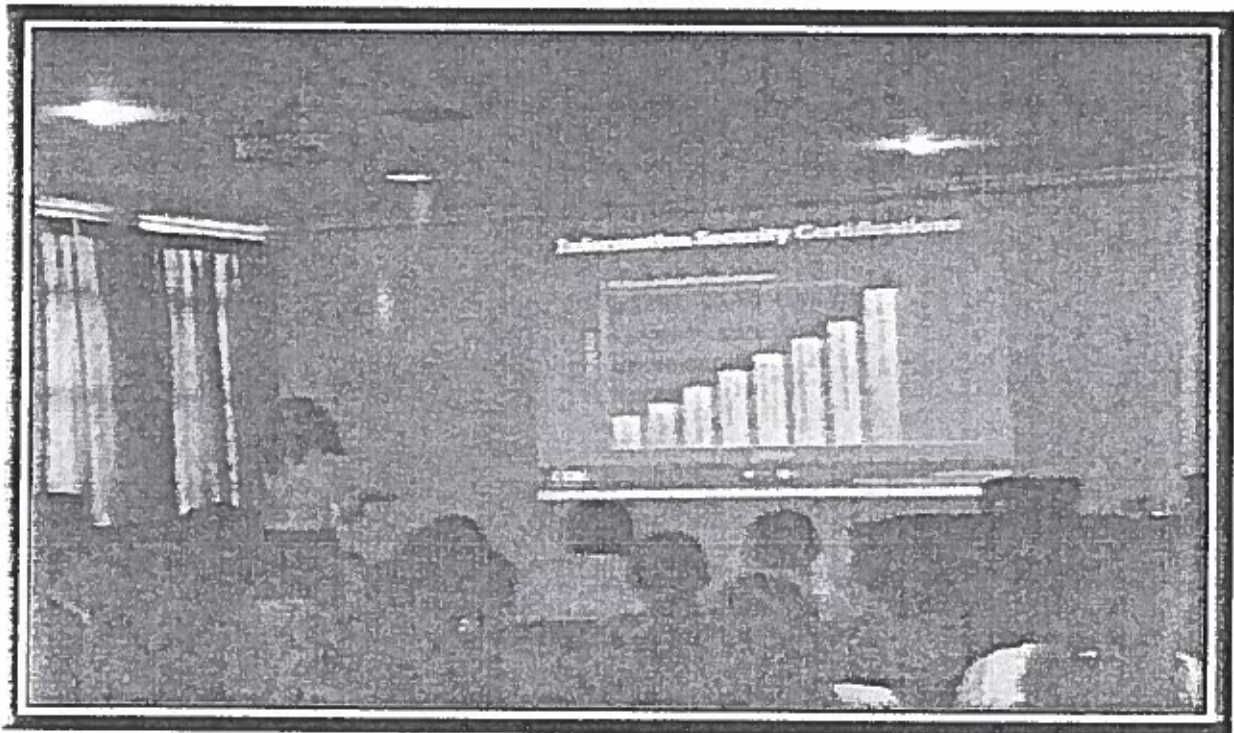

**REPORT FOR “GENDER SENSITIZATION FOR STRENGTHENING WOMEN
PERSPECTIVE IN AGRICULTURE”**

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 07/08/2017 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in ECE seminar hall at 2:30 AM.

B.Revathi Rohini , Additional commissioner, Enforcement, Telangana was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “**GENDER SENSITIZATION FOR STRENGTHENING WOMEN PERSPECTIVE IN AGRICULTURE**”.

Women have been contributing enormously to agricultural growth and development through their involvement in crop production, horticulture, animal husbandry, fisheries, natural resource management etc. Though the proportion of women workers in agriculture has declined, yet they constitute a significant workforce in agriculture. Globally, they constitute about 42% of economically active population in agriculture. Region-wise figures show that agriculture supports a very high proportion of economically active women, particularly in Asia and Africa and in India, it is about 62%. Women’s contribution varies across regions, sociocultural and agro-production systems. On the other hand, the persisting gender gap in access to and control of resources remains an important concern which has not only kept women in a vicious circle of low productivity but also has thrown up questions about inclusive and sustainable growth of the sector. Today, how to bridge the gender gap and empower women with new knowledge and technology is a great challenge, particularly in the context of socioeconomic and climate related

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changes. Importantly, our approach to research, extension and development have not been gender sensitive and there is a general reluctance on part of a large section of researchers, extension and developmental workers to include gender component in programmes. While at global level there has been a lot of concern and action on empowerment of women in agriculture, efforts in India has been slow on this front.

Considering the above, the seminar on 'Gender Sensitisation for Strengthening Women Perspective in Agriculture' was organized to develop the competency of development and extension professionals in strengthening gender component in their development & extension programmes. The material was designed keeping in view the requirements of the participants with different backgrounds. The contents included issues related to women in agriculture in various domains of extension & Development, methodologies for strengthening gender perspective in interventions, gender and data analysis, monitoring and evaluation of gender based R&D projects. All these were compiled to develop this Compendium which, we hope, will be useful for agricultural R&D stakeholders.

She addressed particularly that the issues of women in agriculture for farm mechanization and to reduce their drudgery with increased output researches are carried with the aim to frame strategies for reducing drudgery of farm women to fabricate and disseminate the available drudgery reducing farm tools and equipment to stake holders. In order to demonstrate the output and utilities of gender research, strong partnerships with ICAR institutions, Gender Sensitisation for Strengthening Women Perspective in Agriculture, development agencies, NGOs and international organizations would be worked out in future. Efforts for gender mainstreaming are required to bring social, cultural and attitudinal changes which not only strive for ending the invisibility of women's contribution to agriculture, but of eliminating the drudgery that blights the lives of millions of working women in India. It is important to recognize that women's empowerment through technologies can raise their status only through a meaningful stimulation. There is therefore, needed to have the participation of women at every level in decision making, program formulation and implementation.

DR. Nagaratna P.Hegde, Dept.of CSE, Vasavi College of Engineering was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure "GENDER SENSITIZATION WOMEN IN INDIA".

India has taken challenge of modernizing its economy, reducing poverty and improving living standards of its population. Women power is crucial to the economic growth of any country. Our constitution has granted equal rights to women but in fact they are subjected to differential treatments. A female baby is still unwanted. A girl does not enjoy as much care and attention of her parents as a boy enjoyed. India cannot prosper as a nation unless and until efforts are being made to empower women so that there is equal participation of women in economic growth of the country.

Reformation in society with special reference to gender differences is possible only through gender sensitization. Gender refers to the roles, attitudes, behaviors and activities of men and women in all social relationship, i.e. it is dynamic (changes over time) and constructed by society whereas the term 'sex' refers to biological and physiological characteristics of males and females, i.e. it is inborn characteristics and not dynamic. Sensitization means to create awareness to change the prejudices and discriminative behavior towards the downtrodden section of the society such as woman. so Gender sensitization refers to modification of behavior by raising awareness about gender quality concerns. But "empowerment" means moving from a weak position


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to stronger position to execute a power.

She promoted that the teachers role is very important in promoting / advancing gender sensitization. Education of women is the most powerful tool of change of position in society. Education also brings a reduction in inequalities and functions as a means of improving their status within the family. To encourage the education of women at all levels and for dilution of gender bias in providing knowledge and education, established schools colleges and universities play important role. As boys and girls start developing their gendered identities from birth, so gender sensitization is necessary at the school level.

STRATEGIES / MEASURES TO PROMOTE GENDER SENSITIZATION

1. Providing priorities to women education. It may be mentioned here that University Grant Commission has been promoting the content of women's studies and more specifically setting up of women's studies.
2. Providing space for individual children where they can practice democratic ways of interacting with each other and build skills to negotiate with conflicts outside the school. For girls in particular, school and classrooms should be spaces to discuss processes of decision making, to interrogate the basis of their decisions and to make informed choices.
3. Encouraging educational activities in school for inculcating moral values among children and equal respect for boys and girls.
4. Various safety measures for girls in the school environment.

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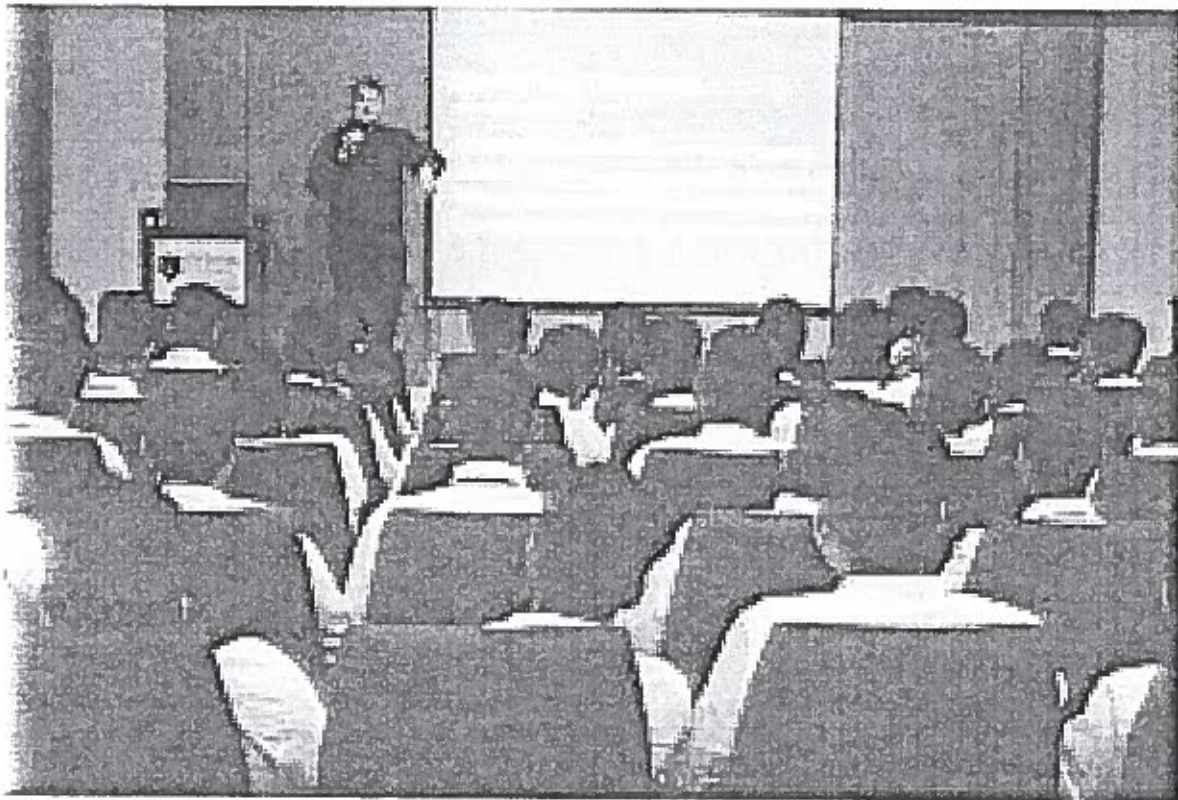

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REPORT FOR “LEGAL RIGHTS OF WOMEN”

Date: 06.09.2017

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 06/09/2017 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in Rudra Memorial hall at 2:30 PM.

Dr. S.B. Dwarakanath, Prof., Dept. of LAW, Osmania University was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “LEGAL RIGHTS OF WOMEN”.

He stressed particularly Crimes against women occur every minute in India. Women are not safe, whether it is in their houses, public places or at the workplace. Your safety in your hands sounds like a clichéd adage to repeat. Given the number of crimes that are committed against women, it is pertinent that women are aware about the laws that are in place.

Remember knowledge is power. As a parent, wife, daughter, employee and a woman these are rights set in place to protect you and it is important that you are aware about these.

Women's and men's rights were almost exactly equal. A woman was entitled to her own private property, including land, livestock, slaves, and servants. A woman had the right to inherit whatever anyone bequeathed to her as a death gift, and in the absence of sons would inherit everything.

According to the International Research Centre for Women, almost 47 percent of girls are married before the age of 18. Currently, India ranks 13 in the world when it comes to child marriages. Since child marriage has been steeped into the Indian culture and tradition since centuries, it has been tough eliminating it. The Prohibition of Child Marriage Act was made

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effective in 2007. This act defines child marriage as a marriage where the groom or the bride are underage, that is, the bride is under 18 years of age or the boy is younger than 21 years

Women had fewer opportunities or privileges than men. For example, in monetary or capital cases women could not serve as witnesses. According to this act, taking or giving of dowry at the time of the marriage to the bride or the bridegroom and their family is to be penalized. Dowry system, giving and taking of dowry, is a norm in India. Dowry is often asked of the bride and her family by the groom and his family. The system has taken strong roots because women after marriage move in with their spouse and in-laws. Also, over the centuries, the lack for economic independence of women and the taboo towards divorce has resulted in bride burning.

When demands for dowry even after marriage are not met by the girl's families, many women are tortured, beaten and even burnt. It is one of the major challenges that our society is grappling with. Women openly complaining about it has helped to spread the

The employment of women and maternity benefits mandated by law. It states that a woman employee who has worked in an organization for a period of at least 80 days during the 12 months preceding the date of her expected delivery is entitled to receive maternity benefits.

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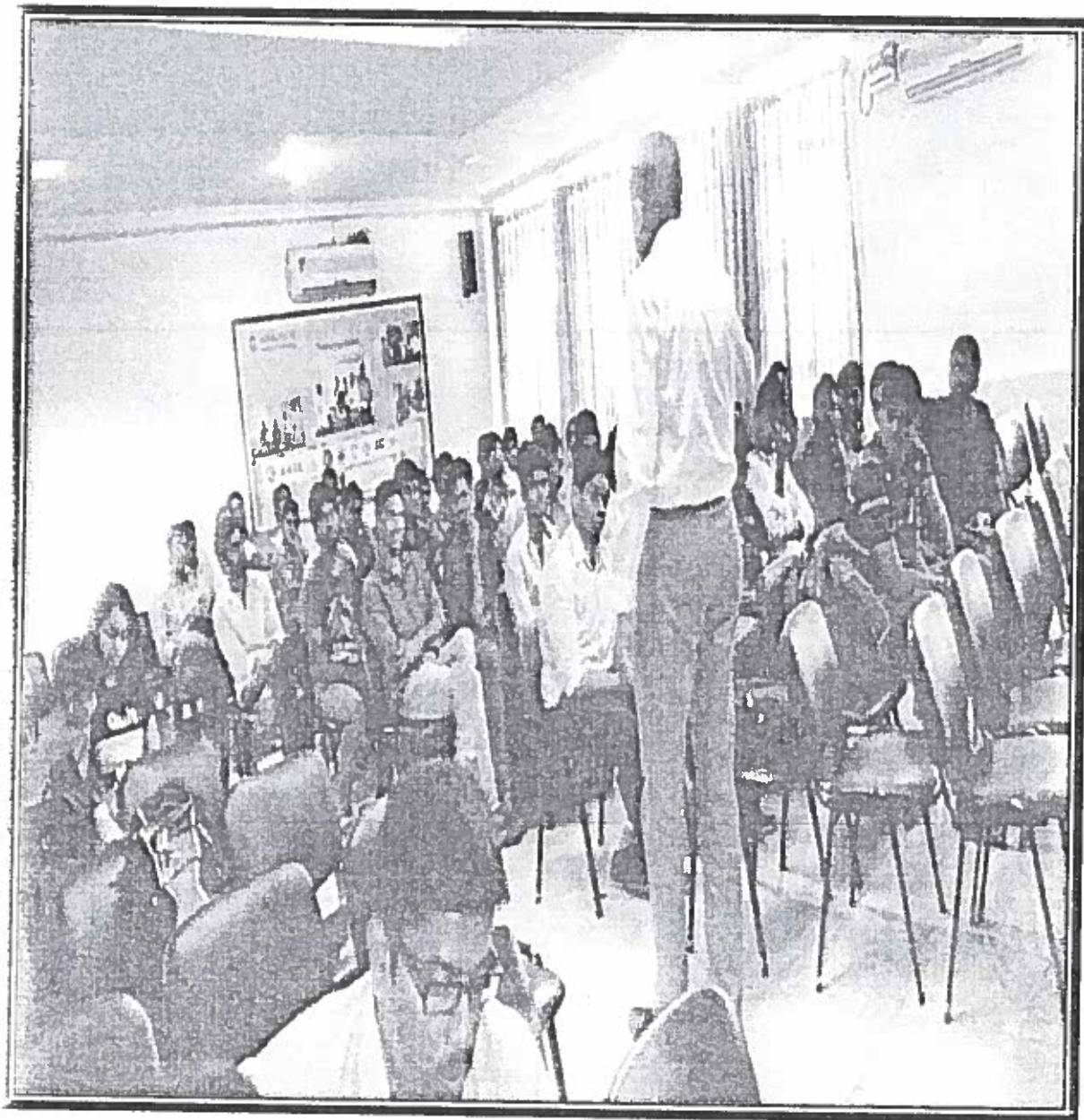

REPORT FOR “SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY”

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 19/09/2017 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in ECE seminar hall at 10:30 AM.

Dr. K. Ramesh Babu, Prof., in CSE Dept, Vignana Jyothi Institute of Technology, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY”

He expressed that Numerous controversies and debates have taken place throughout the history of psychopathology (and its main classification systems) with regards to sexual orientation and gender identity. These are still reflected on present reformulations of gender dysphoria in both the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual and the International Classification of Diseases, and in more or less subtle micro-aggressions experienced by lesbian, gay, bisexual and *trans* patients in mental health care.

It's a common misconception that gender identity and sexual orientation are connected. If someone is transgender, for example, many people automatically assume that they must also be gay. That, however, is not the case. Gender and sexuality are different, and it's an important distinction to understand.

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Gender identity is defined by the Human Rights Campaign as the “innermost concept of self as male, female, a blend of both or neither – how individuals perceive themselves and what they call themselves.” It can mirror what a person was assigned at birth, or be entirely different. There are dozens of genders, outside of just man or woman, that people can identify with.

Controversies and debates with regards to medical classification of sexual orientation and gender identity contribute to the reflection on the very concept of mental illness. The agreement that mental disorders cause subjective distress or are associated with impairment in social functioning was essential for the removal of “homosexuality” from the DSM in the 1970s. Moreover, (trans)gender diagnoses constitute a significant dividing line both within *trans* related activism and the health professionals’ communities. The discussion has taken place between two apposite positions: (1) trans(gender) diagnoses should be removed from health classifying systems, because they promote the pathologization and stigmatization of gender diversity and enhance the medical control of *trans* people’s identities and lives; and (2) trans(gender) diagnoses should be retained in order to ensure access to care, since health care systems rely on diagnoses to justify medical treatment – which many *trans* people need. In fact, *trans* people often describe experiences of severe distress and argue for the need for treatments and access to medical care, but at the same time reject the label of mental illness for themselves. Thus, it may be important to understand how the debate around (trans)diagnoses may be driven also by a history of undue gatekeeping and by stigma involving mental illness.

This seminar states that sexual orientation and gender identity have been viewed, in the history of the field of psychopathology, between two poles: gender transgression and gender variance/fluidity.

On the one hand, aligned with a position of “transgression” and/or “deviation from a norm,” people who today are described as LGBT were labeled as mentally ill. Inevitably, classification systems reflect the existing social attitudes and prejudices, as well as the historical and cultural contexts in which they were developed. In that, they often failed to differentiate between mental illness and socially non-conforming behavior or fluidity of gender expressions. This position and the historical roots of this discourse are still reflected in the practices of some clinicians, ranging from “conversion” therapies to micro-aggressions in the daily lives of LGBT people, including those experienced in the care by mental health professionals.




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On the other hand, lined up with a position of gender variance and fluidity, changes in the diagnostic systems in the last few decades reflect a broader respect and value of the diversity of human sexuality and of gender expressions. This position recognizes that the discourse and practices coming from the (mental) health field may lead to changes in the broader cultural beliefs. As such, it also recognizes the power of medical classifications, health discourses and clinical practices in translating the responsibility of fighting discrimination and promoting LGBT people's well-being.

In conclusion, it seems crucial to emphasize the role of specific training and supervision in the development of clinical competence in the work with sexual minorities. Several authors have argued for the importance of continuous education and training of practitioners in individual and cultural diversity competences, across professional development. This is in line with APA's ethical guidelines, and it is even more relevant when we acknowledge the significant and recent changes in this field. Furthermore, it is founded on the very notion that LGBT competence assumes clinicians ought to be aware of their own personal values, attitudes and beliefs regarding human sexuality and gender diversity in order to provide appropriate care. These ethical concerns, however, have not been translated into training programs in medicine and psychology in a systematic manner in most European countries, and to the mainstreaming of LGBT issues in psychopathology.

Women are involved in all parts of society, but some matters affect and touch women more than others. From the power of the women's vote to reproductive rights and the pay gap.


Few of the major issues that modern women face:

SEXISM AND GENDER BIAS

The "glass ceiling" is a popular phrase that women have been striving to break through for decades. It refers to gender equality, primarily in the workforce, and great progress has been made over the years.

It is no longer uncommon for women to run businesses, even the biggest corporations, or hold job titles in the upper ranks of management. Many women also do jobs that are traditionally male-dominated.

For all the progress that has been made, sexism can still be found. It may be more subtle than it once was, but it makes an appearance in all parts of society, from education and the workforce to the media and politics.


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THE POWER OF THE WOMEN'S VOTE

Women do not take the right to vote lightly. It can be surprising to learn that in recent elections, more American women have voted than men.

Voter turnout is a big deal during elections and women do tend to have a better turnout than men. This is true of all ethnicities and all age groups in both presidential election years and midterm elections. The tide turned in the 1980s and it has not shown signs of slowing down.

THE CYCLE OF THE DOMESTIC ABUSE

Domestic violence is another top concern for women, though this issue affects men as well. It's estimated that 1.3 million women and 835,000 men are physically assaulted by their partners each year. Even teen dating violence is more prevalent than many would hope to admit.

Abuse and violence do not come in a single form, either. From emotional and psychological abuse to sexual and physical abuse, this continues to be a growing problem.

Domestic violence can happen to anyone, yet the most important thing is to ask for help. There are many myths surrounding this issue and one incident can lead to a cycle of abuse.

Feminism is a range of political movements, ideologies, and social movements that share a common goal: to define, establish, and achieve political, economic, personal, and social rights for women that are equal to those of men. This includes seeking to establish equal opportunities for women in education and employment. Feminist movements have campaigned and continue to campaign for women's rights, including the right to vote, to hold public office, to work, to earn fair wages or equal pay, to own property, to receive education, to enter contracts, to have equal rights within marriage, and to have maternity leave. Feminists have also worked to promote bodily autonomy and integrity, and to protect women and girls from rape, sexual harassment, and domestic violence. Feminist campaigns are generally considered to be one of the main forces behind major historical societal changes for women's rights, particularly in the West, where they are near-universally credited with having achieved women's suffrage, gender neutrality in English, reproductive rights for women (including access to contraceptives and abortion), and the

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right to enter into contracts and own property. Although feminist advocacy is, and has been, mainly focused on women's rights, some feminists, including bell hooks, argue for the inclusion of men's liberation within its aims because men are also harmed by traditional gender roles. Feminist theory, which emerged from feminist movements, aims to understand the nature of gender inequality by examining women's social roles and lived experience; it has developed theories in a variety of disciplines in order to respond to issues concerning gender. Numerous feminist movements and ideologies have developed over the years and represent different viewpoints and aims. Some forms of feminism have been criticized for taking into account only white, middle class, and educated perspectives. This criticism led to the creation of ethnically specific or multicultural forms of feminism, including black feminism and intersectional feminism.

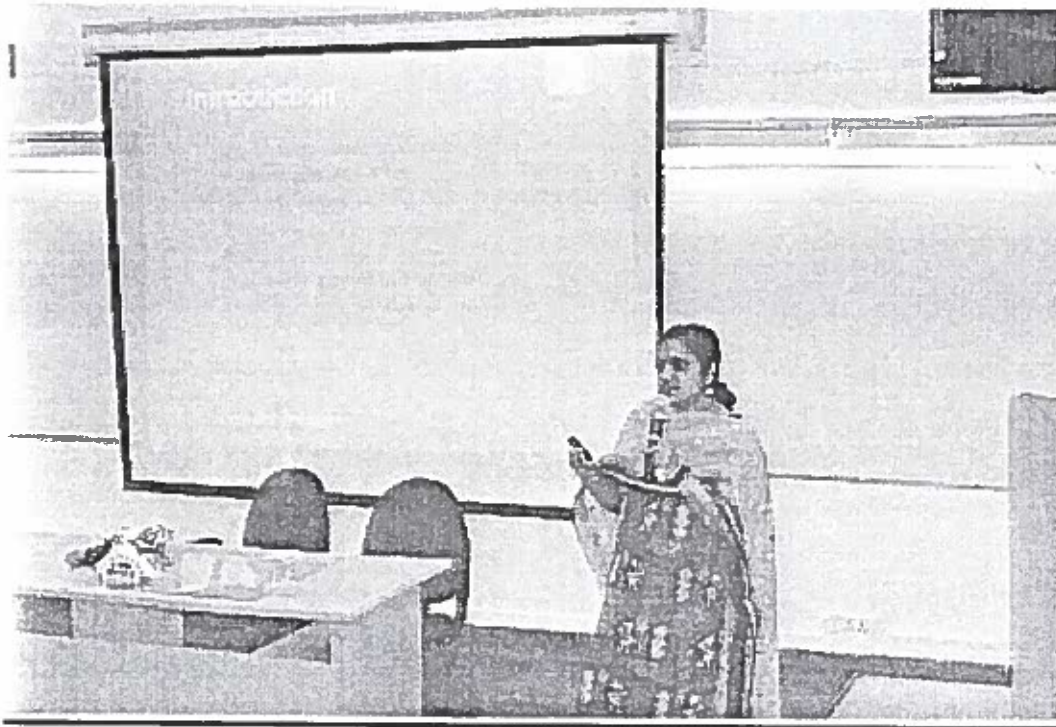

Dr. V.Ushasree, Associate professor, CSE Dept, Vignana Jyothi Institute of Technology, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure "COMPARE THEORIES OF GENDER DEVELOPMENT".

Human differentiation on the basis of gender is a fundamental phenomenon that affects virtually every aspect of people's daily lives. This article presents the social cognitive theory of gender-role development and functioning. It specifies how gender conceptions are constructed from the complex mix of experiences and how they operate in concert with motivational and self-regulatory mechanisms to guide gender-linked conduct throughout the life course. The theory integrates psychological and sociostructural determinants within a unified conceptual structure. In this theoretical perspective, gender conceptions and roles are the product of a broad network of social influences operating interdependently in a variety of societal subsystems. Human evolution provides bodily structures and biological potentialities that permit a range of possibilities rather than dictate a fixed type of gender differentiation. People contribute to their self-development and bring about social changes that define and structure gender relationships through their agentic actions within the interrelated systems of influence.

She expressed that the Interdependence of Gender Socializing Subsystems has the influential role played by each of the various societal subsystems in the differentiation of gender attributes and roles. In social cognitive theory, human development and functioning are highly socially interdependent, richly contextualized and conditionally manifested. In everyday life these different subsystem sources of influence operate interdependently rather than isolatedly. The


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multicausality and reciprocity of influences adds greatly to the complexity of disentangling functional dependencies and their changing dynamics over the course of development. Further progress in understanding the sources, social functions, and personal and social effects of gender differentiation will require greater effort to clarify the complex interplay of the various subsystems of influence within the larger societal context. However, people are not simply the products of social forces acting upon them. In the triadic reciprocity posited by social cognitive theory, people contribute to their self-development and social change through their agentic actions within the interrelated systems of influence.

REPORT FOR “ROLE OF WOMEN IN POLITICS ”

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 30/10/2017 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in CSE seminar hall at 11.00 AM.

Dr. R.Sridevi, Professor, HOD of CSE Dept, Jawarharlal Nehru Technological University of Hyderabad , was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on “ROLE OF WOMEN IN POLITICS”.

She expressed that the term 'political participation' has a very wide meaning. It is not only related to 'Right to Vote', but simultaneously relates to participation in: decision-making process, political activism, political consciousness, etc. Women in India participate in voting, run for public offices and political parties at lower levels more than men. Political activism and voting are the strongest areas of women's political participation. To combat gender inequality in politics, the Indian Government has instituted reservations for seats in local governments.

Women turnout during India's parliamentary general elections was 65.63%, compared to 67.09% turnout for men. India ranks 20th from the bottom in terms of representation of women in Parliament. Women have held the posts of president and prime minister in India, as well as chief ministers of various states. Indian voters have elected women to numerous state legislative assemblies and national parliament for many decades.

The Constitution of India establishes a parliamentary system of government, and guarantees its citizens the right to be elected, freedom of speech, freedom to assemble and form associations, and vote. The Constitution of India attempts to remove gender inequalities by banning



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discrimination based on sex and class, prohibiting human trafficking and forced labor, and reserving elected positions for women.

The Government of India directed state and local governments to promote equality by class and gender including equal pay and free legal aid, humane working conditions and maternity relief, rights to work and education, and raising the standard of living. Women were substantially involved in the Indian independence movement in the early 20th century and advocated for independence from Britain. Independence brought gender equality in the form of constitutional rights, but historically women's political participation has remained low.

Indian women are significantly involved at the grass roots level of activism. The Chipko movement that arose in the 1970s is one example of success among the women's movement in India, as women protested the deforestation in Uttarakhand leading to the protection of the region. Since the Indian independence, women's organizations have focused on issues of violence towards women. Women's movements have focused on rape, female mortality rates, female foeticide, dowry deaths, sati, and domestic abuse. Tragedies such as the Mathura rape case in 1972, the dowry death of Tarvinder Kaur in 1979, the death of Roop Kanwar by practice of sati in 1987, the gang rape of Bhanwari Devi in 1992, and the New Delhi gang rape case in 2012, have kept the movement focused on rape and given rise to many women's organizations at the local and national level.

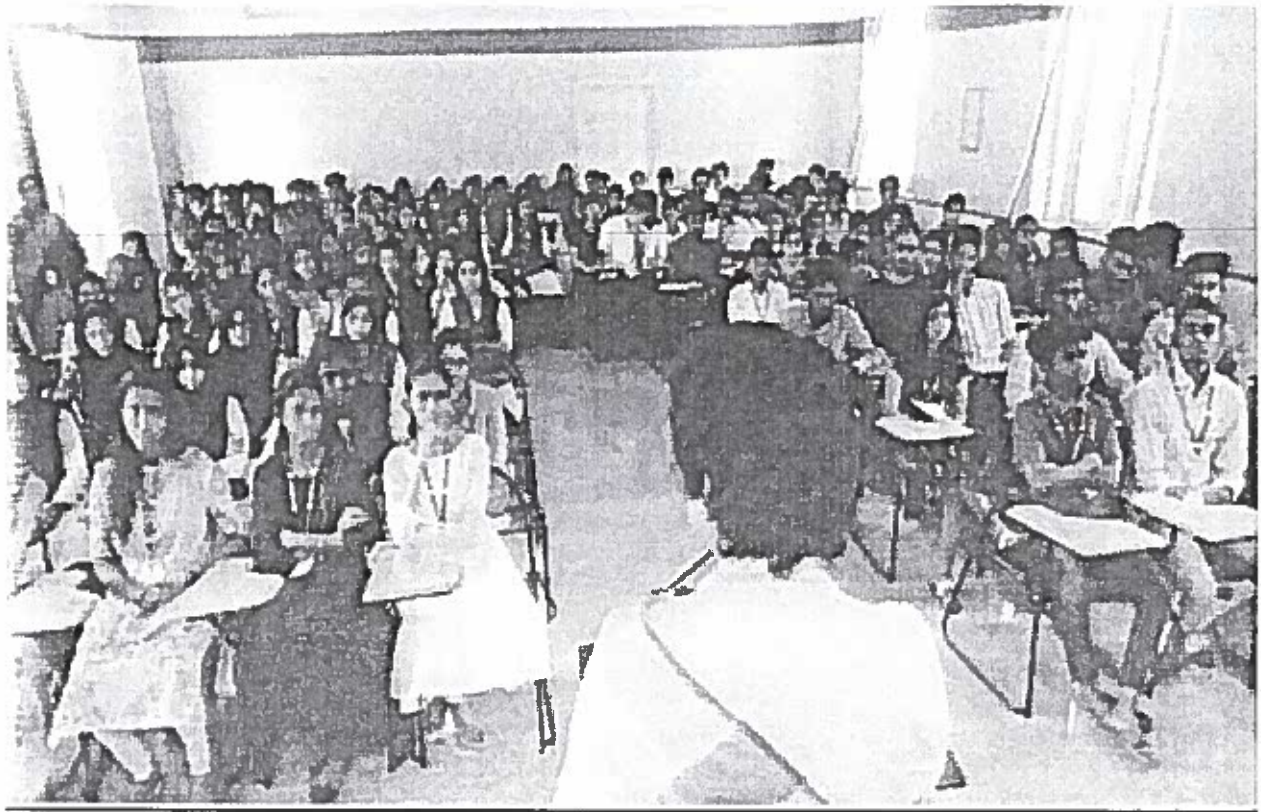

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 6/11/2017 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in CSE seminar hall at 2.00 PM.

Mrs. G Vijaya Kumari Ph.D, Professor & HOD of IT Dept, IARE, Dundigal, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on "CULTURE AND SEX ROLE STEREOTYPES IN ADVERTISEMENTS".

She expressed that the Media is the most pervasive and one of the powerful tools in viewing and projecting product promotion related images and messages. Media insinuates its messages into our consciousness, many of which perpetuate unrealistic, stereotypical, and limit perceptions, e.g., women images. Gender stereotyping in media, where women are under-represented, that erroneously implies that men are the cultural standard and women are insignificant or indiscernible propagating patriarchic hegemonic ideology. Portrayal of women in media, across the globe, to sell various products to the consumers with a female face or images though the target users /consumers could be male or female both have been rampant leading to gender stereotyping. Women face or body images have been predominant factors to draw attention of the consumers to capture the market because such media imposition of gender stereotyping is believed to have an impact on individual and family decision-making and ultimately on the sales of consumer goods and services. Such gender based promotions of products are most common strategies practiced by advertisers to establish a strong connection with a brand. Through stereotyped representation of women, media distorts reality and reconfirms sex bias. Whether it

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is prime-time television, in which there are atypical projection of women to sell or to promote a product/brand, right from a bathing soap, a detergent packet, rice or oil, cuisine spices where women has been projected the sole caretaker as homemakers and skilled with domesticity, or a model of car where women are supposed to sit back lazily on seat and the man drives on the road and grips the wheel projecting how inactive and passive they are in real- world, thus gender stereotype persists. As an offshoot of such stereotyping in virtual and visual world, the cultural predicament becomes more dominating on how a woman should present oneself even in reality. Constant distortion imposes and induces a belief that women have to suit to themselves and present them to certain level that is set by cultural standard and popular perception. Focus of the Present Paper: The present discussion is relevant and important in the context of Indian Market, where, gender stereotyping is an overt practice and considered as a norm to sell a product. Women as projected through various segmentation of product promotions (be it domestic items, apparel or luxury product) advertisements reinforced „women image“ as domestic member, dependent on men, as sex-object or an ornamental gender who do not make important decisions, popularly as housewife (or a caring mother), and mostly portrayed as house bound whereas men are shown as decision maker and in a commanding role. Men are projected as expert primarily in work setting or as a voice of narrator in decision making in the house, economy and family matters. The present study examined the portrayal of women in Indian visual and print media. Using content analysis of advertisements that were examined from the editions of few popular magazines, like fashion journals like Femina, OUTLOOK, or popular Indian TV channels published/advertised during 2013-2014. The study focuses on various products and brands. It examines prevalence of female stereotyping in Indian media, where a woman across all ages stands as the best choice for brand promotion by advertisers and preferred by corporates. The present seminar also evaluates the influence of culturally prescribed sex roles on individuals' reactions to sex role characterizations in promotions, the gendering of products, and one's selfconcept (which purportedly underlies sex role stereotypic perceptions) towards gender.

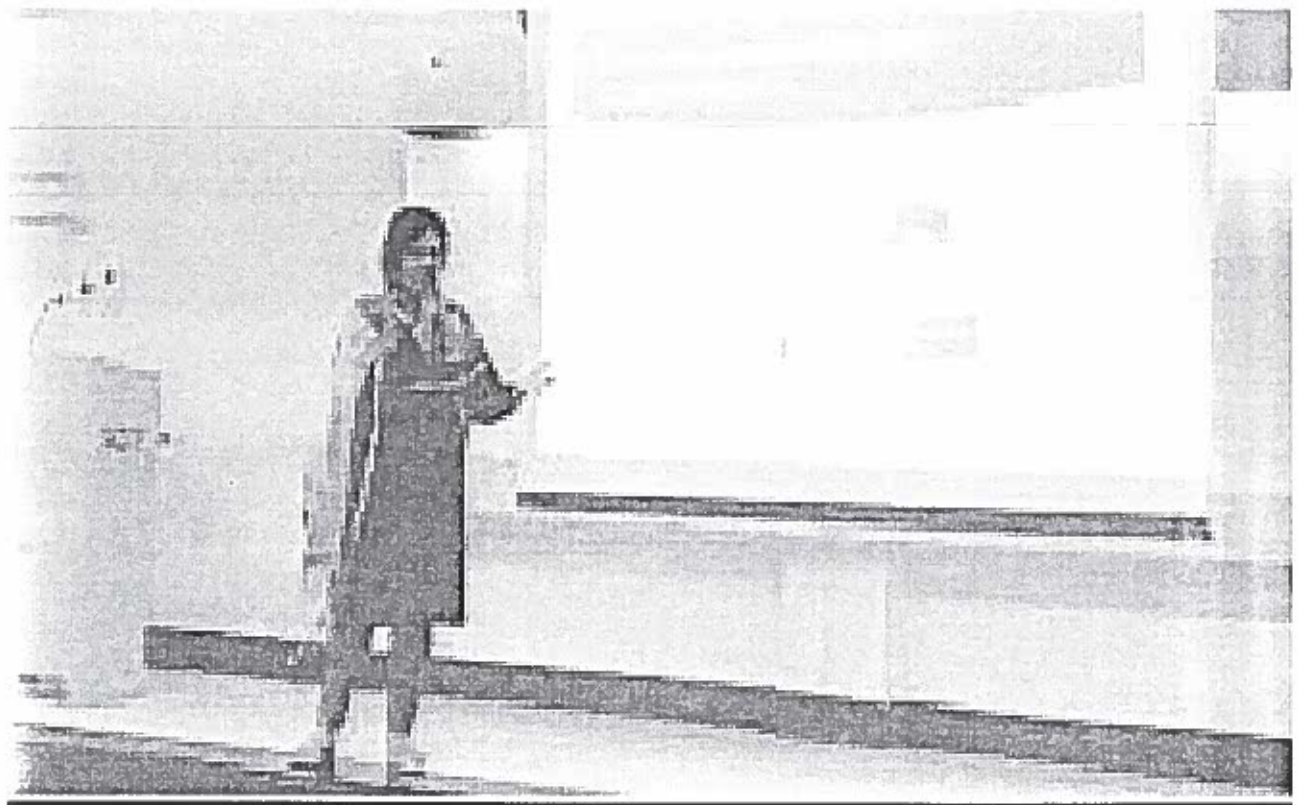



she stressed that Academic Causes and sex equity, also referred to as **"Equity in education"**, is a measure of achievement, fairness, and opportunity in education. The study of education equity is often linked with the study of excellence and equity.

Educational equity depends on two main factors. The first is fairness, which implies that factors specific to one's personal conditions should not interfere with the potential of academic success. The second important factor is inclusion, which refers to a comprehensive standard that applies to everyone in a certain education system. These two factors are closely related and depend on each other for an educational system's success.

The growing importance of education equity is based on the premise that an individual's level of education directly correlates to future quality of life. Therefore, an academic system that practices educational equity is a strong foundation of a society that is fair and thriving. However, inequity in education is challenging to avoid, and can be broken down into inequity due to socioeconomic standing, race, gender or disability. Educational equity is also based in the historical context of the location, people and structure. History shapes the outcome of individuals within the education system.

Gender equity in practicality refers to both male and female concerns, yet most of the gender bias is against women in the developing world. Gender discrimination in education has been very evident and underlying problem in many countries, especially in developing countries where cultural and societal stigma continue to hinder growth and prosperity for women. Global Campaign for Education (GCE) followed a survey called "Gender Discrimination in Violation of Rights of Women and Girls" states that one tenth of girls in primary school are 'unhappy' and this number increases to one fifth by the time they reach secondary schools. Some of the reasoning's that girls provided include harassment, restorations to freedom, and an inherent lack of opportunities, compared to boys. United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) understands Education as a " fundamental human right and essential for the exercise of all other human rights. It promotes individual freedom and empowerment and yields important development benefits.

UN Special Rapporteur Katarina Tomasevki developed the '4A' framework on the Right to Education. The '4A' framework encompasses availability, accessibility, acceptability and adaptability as fundamental to the institution of education. And yet girls in many underdeveloped countries are denied secondary education. Figure on the right shows the discrepancies in secondary education in the world. Countries such as Sudan, Somalia, Thailand and Afghanistan face the highest of inequity when it comes to gender bias

Gender-based inequity in education is not just a phenomenon in developing countries. A New York Times article highlighted how education systems, especially the public school system, tend to cause segregation between genders. Boys and girls are often taught with different approaches, which programs children to think they are different and deserve different treatment. However, studies show that boys and girls learn differently, and therefore should be taught differently. Boys learn better when they keep moving, while girls learn better sitting in one place with silence. Therefore—in this reasoning—segregating the genders *promotes* gender equity in education, as both boys and girls have optimized learning.

Mrs. A. Jayaree, Associate professor, English Dept, Vignana Bharathi Institute of Technology was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on “PRACTICAL ATTITUDES AND STEREOTYPES IN FAMILY RELATIONS”.

She expressed that Every human being holds thousands of attitudes, including those about family and friends, political figures, abortion rights, terrorism, preferences for music, and much more. Each of our attitudes has its own unique characteristics, and no two attitudes come to us or influence us in quite the same way. Research has found that some of our attitudes are inherited, at least in part, via genetic transmission from our parents. Other attitudes are learned mostly through direct and indirect experiences with the attitude objects. disgusted by cockroaches), whereas other attitudes—such as our preferences for different styles of music or art—are more individualized.

Moving beyond recognition that gender stereotyping is an obstacle to women’s rights to meaningful progress in implementing human rights obligations to address harmful stereotypes and wrongful stereotyping will require all of us – treaty bodies, special procedures, States Parties, civil society, academics and many others – to give this issue the serious attention it deserves.


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Stereotypical beliefs about gender, which rigidly characterize differences between sexes and appropriate gender roles, are pervasive in most societies. These deep-seated beliefs reflect the society's expectations that individuals behave and make choices in accordance with their gender. Examples of gender stereotyped beliefs and how they are reflected in behaviors and attitudes abound. They can be expressed in parents choosing rigidly-gendered toys for their children or steering them (subtly or blatantly) toward certain educational and occupational choices that are deemed to be suitable for their gender. They can be expressed in social backlash against or disapproval of certain behaviors on the part of women, such as aggressiveness or ambition. To the extent that they are ingrained in a society and influence the actual choices and outcomes of individuals, these beliefs may in large part contribute to gender-achievement gaps as well as the underrepresentation of women in top executive positions and in leadership. As ample evidence suggests, such gender inequality, factually confirming and perpetuating traditional gender role beliefs, can be quite persistent. The formation of gender role beliefs and conforming behaviors and attitudes likely begin very early in childhood, and have a significant role in the development of cognitive and noncognitive skills. Through the intergenerational transmission of preferences and beliefs, families have the earliest, most direct impact on the development of children's cognitive and social development. The channels of such transmission could be outright didactic teaching or a more indirect influence via parenting styles (including the language used with the kids) and providing role models. Examples for the former would be iterating what girls should and should not do, and discouraging male-typed behavior (girls are taught to be more obedient, kind and sharing), and examples for the latter would be a family where household chores are females' responsibility and males have more say in important decisions. Intergenerational transmission in the family may have important implications for children's attitudes, behavior and outcomes. It has been documented that transmission of gender attitudes from mothers affects daughters' as well as daughter-in-laws' labor force participation and human capital.

Dr. M.Ramabai, Professor in CSE Department, Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Technology was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on “CAUSES OF SEX DIFFERENCES AND SIMILARITIES IN BEHAVIOUR”.

She expressed that What are the causes of sex differences and similarities in behavior? Some causes can be traced to human evolutionary history, especially the ways that the division of labor is influenced by biology and environments. A human universal--in all known societies--is a division of tasks so that men do some things in society and women do others. The specific activities in a society depend on what tasks can be performed most efficiently by each sex, given men's greater size, strength, and speed and women's bearing and nursing children.

The division of labor structures psychological sex differences and similarities. By observing the activities of women and men in their society, people form gender role beliefs or sex-typed expectations. For example, given that women perform more childcare than men in most industrialized societies, women are believed to be especially nurturant and caring. Given that men are more likely than women to hold higher status jobs in industrialized societies, men are believed to be especially dominant and assertive. Gender roles then influence behavior through



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social and biological processes. In social interaction, people respond more favorably to others who conform to gender role expectations. Women and men also might incorporate gender roles into their own personal identities. Additionally, hormonal processes support role performance. Females enjoy a general advantage in communication skills, both in the verbal domain and in the production and decoding of nonverbal displays. The higher expressiveness of females is reflected in a higher frequency of both smiling and crying; gender differences in crying are especially robust and tend to increase in more gender egalitarian countries. Consistent with the data on personality and social relations males tend to use more assertive speech and interrupt their conversation partners. However gender differences in language use are highly dependent on contextual factors, testifying to the remarkable strategies flexibility of human communication.

EDCUATION”**

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 19/12/2017 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in Rudra Memorial hall at 11.00 AM.

Dr. B.V. Kiranmayee, Associate Professor & HOD, Department of CSE, VNRVJIT was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on “GENDER STEREOTYPES IN SCIENCE AND EDCUATION ”.

She expressed that More men are studying and working in science fields than women. This could be an effect of the prevalence of gender stereotypes (e.g., science is for men, not for women). Aside from the media and people's social lives, such stereotypes can also occur in education. Ways in which stereotypes are visible in education include the use of gender-biased visuals, language, teaching methods, and teachers' attitudes. The goal of this study was to determine whether science education resources for primary school contained gender-biased visuals. Specifically, the total number of men and women depicted, and the profession and activity of each person in the visuals were noted. The analysis showed that there were more men than women depicted with a science profession and that more women than men were depicted as teachers. This study shows that there is a stereotypical representation of men and women in online science education resources, highlighting the changes needed to create a balanced representation of men and women. Even if the stereotypical representation of men and women in science is a true reflection of the gender distribution in science, we should aim for a more balanced representation. Such a balance is an essential first step towards showing children that both men and women can do science, which will contribute to more gender-balanced science and technology fields.

In order to counteract gender stereotypes in science education resources, it is important that the number of men and women in the visual content of educational resources is balanced, as well as the number of boys and girls. In this manner, girls can see that science is for women as well as for men. In addition, the type of professions and activities of men and women should be portrayed equally, as well as that of boys and girls. Related to this is to balance the number of people mentioned in texts, with regard to gender. In this way, stories in science education resources about boy characters and girl characters will be balanced. Another important way to counteract gender stereotypes in science education resources is by using gender-balanced language.

Future research should explore whether there are any differences between different science fields (e.g., astronomy, biology, chemistry, geology, mathematics, physics, and technology) with regard to the gender distribution for professions and activities in education resources. Since the distribution of men and women is different in different science fields], it can be expected that science education resources from the fields where there are many more men than women show a bigger gender imbalance than those of science fields where there is an equal distribution of men and women. Testing this will, therefore, offer two main insights: 1) which fields need to do much work to achieve more gender-balanced education resources about those science fields and 2) which fields already have relatively gender-neutral education resources. It is expected that resources about biology, for example, are less gender-biased than those about physics or astronomy.

In conclusion, we found that in the studied online science education resources, women and men are portrayed in stereotypic ways, with more men depicted with science professions and more women depicted as teachers. Even if this is a true reflection of the distribution of men and women in those professions, we should aim for a more balanced representation so girls and boys see examples of both female and male scientists. We believe that a more balanced view will help girls and boys to make their own decisions concerning their studies and professions rather than those decisions being influenced by gender stereotypes.

**REPORT FOR “GENDER-SENSITIZATION IN INDIAN SCIENCE -
CURRENT SCIENCE”**

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 30/12/2017 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in Rudra Memorial hall at 2.00 PM.

Dr. P.Sridevi, Associate Professor, Dept. of ENGLISH, IARE was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on “GENDER-SENSITIZATION IN INDIAN SCIENCE - CURRENT SCIENCE”.

She expressed that the seminar states to identify the status of online science education resources with regard to gender-biased visual content. With regard to the professions and activities of the men and women in the online science resources more men than women were depicted in science professions and more women than men were depicted as teachers. They found that women were depicted as teachers twice as often as men in all textbooks they studied, including texts on science and on mathematics. Similarly to the profession outcomes, in activities, we found that there were more women than men performing the activity of teaching. However, the activity category ‘experiment’ was not significantly different in numbers of men and women. As for children, no significant differences between the number of boys and girls in any activity category in these resources have been found. Children, as opposed to adults, are thus presented in a gender balanced manner.

The present study shows no evidence of gender balance concerning adults in science and as scientists in online science education resources. Not only are men depicted more often than women in general in the studied resources, they are also depicted relatively more often in a

science profession. Children, on the other hand, are depicted in a gender balanced manner with respect to types of activities, which is a positive sign and might help girls see themselves as capable of doing science. However, the adults in pictures and videos may serve as role models, making it very important that those visuals are also gender balanced. Accordingly, we can conclude that there is already a gender imbalance in the visuals of science education resources for children at primary school level. The stereotyping of men in science and women in teaching is, thus, already present at this very early level of education. The earlier this imbalance is presented to children, the more impact it may have on them. At least for girls aged 5 to 7, stereotypes already affect their math test results. Therefore, gender stereotypes in science education resources should be counteracted.

In conclusion, we found that in the studied online science education resources, women and men are portrayed in stereotypic ways, with more men depicted with science professions and more women depicted as teachers. Even if this is a true reflection of the distribution of men and women in those professions, we should aim for a more balanced representation so girls and boys see examples of both female and male scientists. We believe that a more balanced view will help girls and boys to make their own decisions concerning their studies and professions rather than those decisions being influenced by gender stereotypes.

Dr.G.Annapurna, Associate Professor in Electrical Department, Narayanamma Institute of Technology, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “PROGRAM ON BETI UJJWAL”

She stressed particularly Education is a basic human right that should be exercised fully in all nations. but for many girls in India. attending school is not an option. A girl's education is an essential starting point in establishing equality everywhere. Despite the Indian Constitution guaranteeing equality before the law and non-discrimination on the basis of sex, India remains a patriarchal society.

Male inheritance and property ownership, early marriage, dowry, honor crimes, lack girls' education. which hunting, violence against women, and trafficking are all serious issues in the country. There are schools, but most girls do not attend. often because of religious reasons or cultural pressures.

The impact of education on girls is extraordinary. Education sustains human values. It forms the foundation for learning and critical thinking. Education also provides skills for girls to become more self-reliant and provides them with more opportunities. Thinking into the future, education also provides them with the knowledge to manage health problems.



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A girl understanding her own body can make the difference between an unwanted pregnancy and an illegal abortion. Having the knowledge beforehand is crucial to saving and protecting lives.

The first reason why girls are pulled out of school is because of family responsibilities. Girls provide free labor at home for the family. Home is also where they learn to be a better housewife. Many girls are kept at home because it is a better payoff than going to school. Having the girl attend school is not valuable to the whole family.

The family plays a central role in a girl's life and shaping her future. Respect is given to elders in all situations and no decision can be made without consulting an elder. This often leads to the practice of arranged marriages. The decision is entirely up to the family and the girl often does not even see her future husband until the day of the wedding. Compared to American norms, individuals growing up in India are much more dependent on their families, especially parents.

The second reason why girls are kept from receiving a primary education is because they are pulled out early to protect family honor. This also can affect the dowry when the girl is married. The boy's side of the family can raise the dowry if they suspect she has been in school with boys during puberty. The practice of dowry is illegal, but laws are not always implemented. If the dowry cannot be paid, the bride runs the risk of being ruined, or worse, being killed. Honor killings are prevalent among the poor.

The government's response can help the whole process of providing primary schools for girls. The Indian government has recognized the problem but has been slow to act on the issue. As mentioned earlier, education is not a priority for the government right now; rather the government is focused on the economy. Without girls being involved in the future economy, the government is taking a risk and putting the issue off for another generation.



The position of women in politics is weak, though at top level there were and are remarkable exceptions. With the 2009 elections, women representation in the lower house of parliament increased to 11%. In recent years many women have been confronted with domestic violence and sexual harassment.

The global economic crisis has had a rather modest impact on India’s economy, and the prospects for the country’s rebound seem bright. Yet, in 2008-09 the decline in manufacturing exports has caused serious problems for in particular women.

Telephone use is rapidly switching from fixed line to cellular phone networks. In 2009, already 365 of each 1,000 in the population used a cell phone. Internet coverage is growing but still low, with one in 12 surfing on the Internet. Television is a popular medium: over half of all households have a TV set. Cable TV proves to have emancipator force, especially for rural women.


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India has ratified only four of eight core ILO Labour Conventions. In practice workers' rights are only legally protected for the small minority working in the organized sector. Even formally the freedom of association is limited. Strikes are prohibited in the public sector.

On average the female share in membership and decision-making remains low. In contrast, strongholds of female organizing have emerged as responses to problems in informal labour

The female shares of graduated were higher than the male shares in banking and finance real estate and business services, and transport. Among the 15-29 of age, the gender gap was considerably smaller.

It is found that acceptance of unequal gender norms by women are still prevailing in the society. More than half of the women believe wife beating to be justified for one reason or the other. Fewer women have final say on how to spend their earnings. Control over cash earnings increases with age, education and with place of residence. Women's exposure to media is also less relative to men.

Rural women are more prone to domestic violence than that of urban women. A large gender gap exists in political participation too. The study concludes by an observation that access to education and employment are only the enabling factors to empowerment. achievement towards the goal, however, depends largely on the attitude of the people towards gender equality.



The purpose of the Act Section 1. The purpose of this Act is to combat discrimination based on any of the following grounds: sex, ethnic origin, religion or other belief, sexual orientation or disability.

Other provisions prohibiting discrimination Section 2. Provisions prohibiting discrimination are also found in – the Equal Opportunities Act (1991:433),

– the Act on Measures against Discrimination in Working Life on Grounds of Ethnic Origin, Religion or other Belief (1999:130),

– the Prohibition of Discrimination in Working Life on Grounds of Disability Act (1999:132),

– the Act on a Ban against Discrimination in Working Life on Grounds of Sexual Orientation (1999:133), – the Equal Treatment of Students at Universities Act (2001:1286). and,

– the Act Prohibiting Discriminatory and Other Degrading Treatment of Children and Pupils (2006:67) Chapter 16 Section 9 of the Swedish Penal Code contains provisions on unlawful discrimination. (2006:69)


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Definitions

Discrimination Section 3. In this Act discrimination is defined as follows:

1. direct discrimination: when an individual is disadvantaged by being treated less favourably than someone else is being, has been or would have been treated in a comparable situation, if such treatment is associated with the person's sex, ethnic origin, religion or other belief, sexual orientation or disability;
2. indirect discrimination: when an individual is disadvantaged by the application of provisions, criteria or practices that are apparently neutral but in practice are particularly disadvantageous to individuals of a particular sex, ethnic origin, religion or other belief, sexual orientation or disability, in so far as these provisions, criteria or practices cannot be justified by legitimate aims and the means are appropriate and necessary for achieving these aims;
3. harassment: conduct that violates a person's dignity and that is associated that person's sex, ethnic origin, religion or other belief, sexual orientation or disability;
4. sexual harassment: any type of conduct of a sexual nature that violates a person's dignity;
5. instructions to discriminate: orders or instructions to discriminate against an individual as described in Subsections 1–4 that are given to someone who is either in a subordinate or dependent position relative to the person who gives the orders or instructions or who has undertaken to act on that person's behalf. (2005:480)

Prohibition of discrimination

Labour market Section 5. Discrimination against employees or job seekers that is associated with a person's sex, ethnic origin, religion or other belief, sexual orientation or disability, is prohibited

1. in job placement services offered by public employment offices or other organisations or parties offering employment services, and





Human differentiation on the basis of gender is a fundamental phenomenon that affects virtually every aspect of people’s daily lives. This article presents the social cognitive theory of gender-role development and functioning. It specifies how gender conceptions are constructed from the complex mix of experiences and how they operate in concert with motivational and self-regulatory mechanisms to guide gender-linked conduct throughout the life course. The theory integrates psychological and sociostructural determinants within a unified conceptual structure. In this theoretical perspective, gender conceptions and roles are the product of a broad network of social influences operating interdependently in a variety of societal subsystems. Human evolution provides bodily structures and biological potentialities that permit a range of possibilities rather than dictate a fixed type of gender differentiation. People contribute to their self-development and bring about social changes that define and structure gender relationships through their agentic actions within the interrelated systems of influence.

She expressed that the Interdependence of Gender Socializing Subsystems has the influential role played by each of the various societal subsystems in the differentiation of gender attributes and roles. In social cognitive theory, human development and functioning are highly socially interdependent, richly contextualized and conditionally manifested. In everyday life these different subsystem sources of influence operate interdependently rather than isolatedly. The

multicausality and reciprocity of influences adds greatly to the complexity of disentangling functional dependencies and their changing dynamics over the course of development. Further progress in understanding the sources, social functions, and personal and social effects of gender differentiation will require greater effort to clarify the complex interplay of the various subsystems of influence within the larger societal context. However, people are not simply the products of social forces acting upon them. In the triadic reciprocity posited by social cognitive theory, people contribute to their self-development and social change through their agentic actions within the interrelated systems of influence.

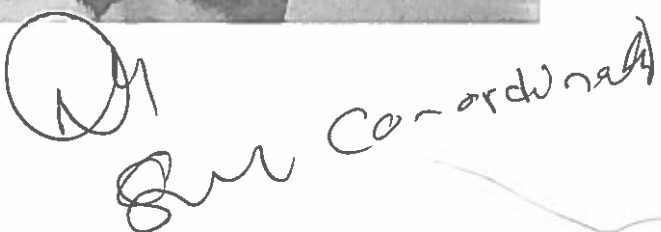

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 7/8/2018 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal **Dr.Y.Ellamraj** in CSE seminar hall at 02.30PM

N.Sreenivasa Rao Associate Professor I.A.R.E.

was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “**Empowering women through gender sensitization**”.

Gender sensitization refers to the modification of behavior by raising awareness of gender equality concerns. This can be achieved by conducting various sensitization campaigns, workshop, programs etc. Gender sensitization refers to theories which claim that modification of the behavior of teachers and parents (etc.) towards children can have a causal effect on gender equality. Gender sensitizing is about changing behavior and instilling empathy into the views that we hold about our own and the other sex." It helps people in "examining their personal attitudes and beliefs and questioning the 'realities they thought they know.

Gender sensitization makes people more sensitive towards the problem of women and so they tend to think about different reforms required to raise the status of women by empowering them . It initiates Policy makers to address gender related issues as a priority as gender bias hinders in attaining an equitable social and economic order.

According to the Country Report of the Government of India. “Empowerment means moving from a weak position to exercise a power.” Education of women is the most powerful tool of

change of position in society. Education also brings a reduction in inequalities and functions as a means of improving their status within the family. To encourage the education of women at all levels and for dilution of gender bias in providing knowledge and education, established schools, colleges and universities play important role.

She stressed particularly to provide a critical perspective on the socialization of men and women. Gender inequality is a long-term problem in our society and female are discriminated in many ways in the social context of India, although legally women have equal right. Thus, there is a great need to sensitize the society on gender issues so that there would be no discrimination on the basis of gender. Women empowerment through gender sensitization is one of the key criteria to unlock the potential of women. REPORT FOR “LADIKI KA SWADHAR”

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 15/8/2018 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in seminar hall at 11.30AM.

Dr.K.Durgabhavani, Professor in English Department, O.U women’s College Koti. Was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “LADIKI KA SWADHAR”.

She stressed particularly awareness amongst young female workers about their employment opportunities and career possibilities, family building and the work family Balance

The position of women in politics is weak, though at top level there were and are remarkable exceptions. With the 2009 elections, women representation in the lower house of parliament increased to 11%. In recent years many women have been confronted with domestic violence and sexual harassment.

The global economic crisis has had a rather modest impact on India’s economy, and the prospects for the country’s rebound seem bright. Yet, in 2008-09 the decline in manufacturing exports has caused serious problems for in particular women.

Telephone use is rapidly switching from fixed line to cellular phone networks. In 2009, already 365 of each 1,000 in the population used a cell phone. Internet coverage is growing but still low, with one in 12 surfing on the Internet. Television is a popular medium: over half of all households have a TV set. Cable TV proves to have emancipator force, especially for rural women.

India has ratified only four of eight core ILO Labour Conventions. In practice workers’ rights are only legally protected for the small minority working in the organized sector. Even formally the freedom of association is limited. Strikes are prohibited in the public sector.

On average the female share in membership and decision-making remains low. In contrast, strongholds of female organizing have emerged as responses to problems in informal labour

The female shares of graduated were higher than the male shares in banking and finance real

estate and business services, and transport. Among the 15-29 of age, the gender gap was considerably smaller.

It is found that acceptance of unequal gender norms by women are still prevailing in the society. More than half of the women believe wife beating to be justified for one reason or the other. Fewer women have final say on how to spend their earnings. Control over cash earnings increases with age, education and with place of residence. Women's exposure to media is also less relative to men.

Rural women are more prone to domestic violence than that of urban women. A large gender gap exists in political participation too. The study concludes by an observation that access to education and employment are only the enabling factors to empowerment, achievement towards the goal, however, depends largely on the attitude of the people towards gender equality.

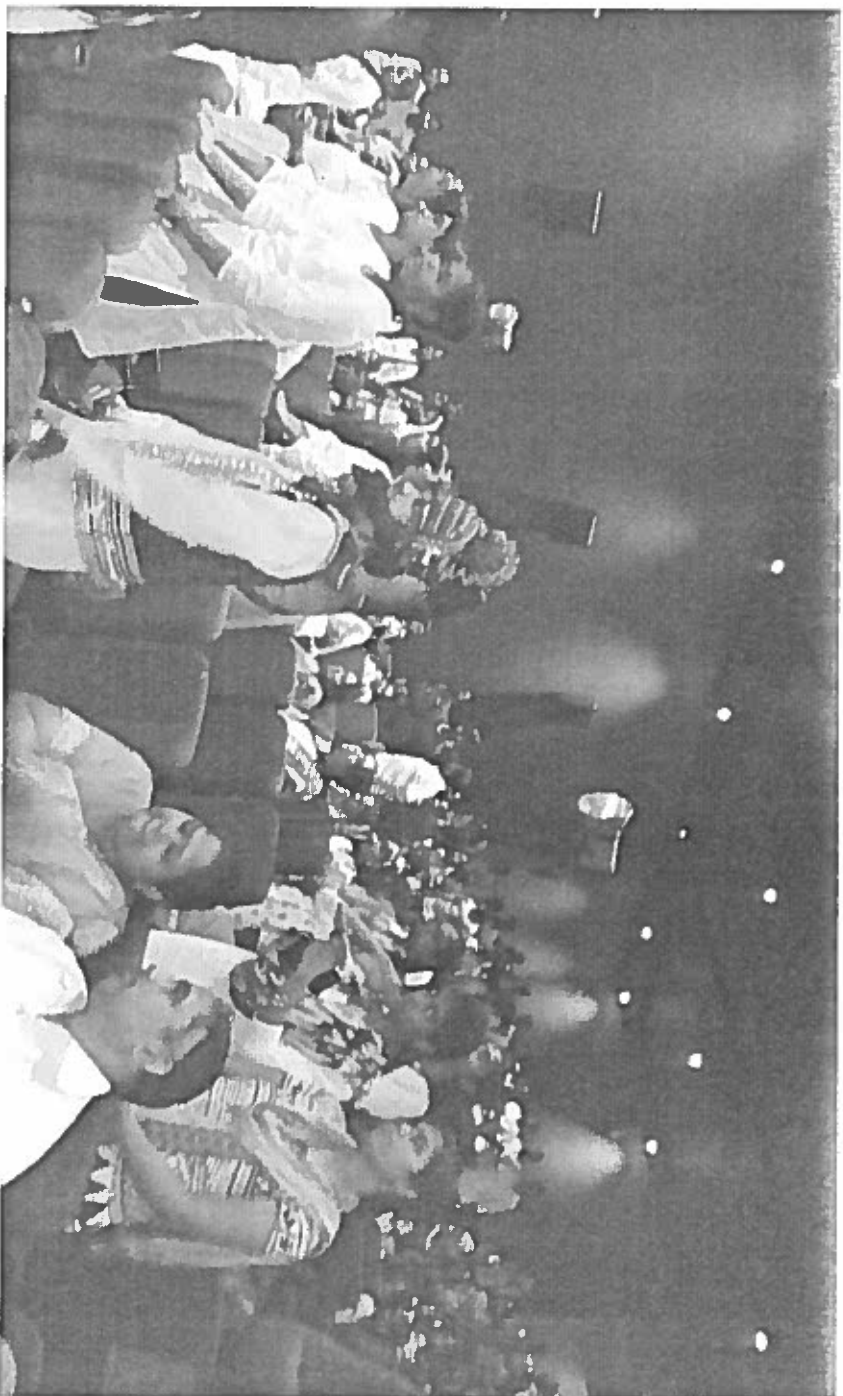

This sensitivity to understand the qualities or weakness of other gender and to respect it, bring best out of the person to build a strong society, work place and nation.

The law has been formulated to safeguard the dignity of woman at work place i.e. The Sexual Harassment of Woman at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition & Redressal) Act,2013. The Act provides for very stringent mandatory compliances for the employers and strict action against the offender. The Act also provides for mandatory awareness programmes to be conducted in every organisation. Non-Compliance of any of the provisions of the Act attracts serious penal action for employers. Thus, every employee and employer requires to know the basic provisions of the Act to avoid any legal complication.

The one day seminar is to understand the concept & insight of the law relating to Prevention of Sexual Harassment of woman at work place. This will be suitable for both genders. This will create a safe and healthy environment for women in the organisation resulting into better output.

She stressed particularly to provide a critical perspective on the socialization of men and women. Gender inequality is a long-term problem in our society and female are discriminated in many ways in the social context of India, although legally women have equal right. Thus, there is a great need to sensitize the society on gender issues so that there would be no discrimination on the basis of gender. Women empowerment through gender sensitization is one of the key criteria to unlock the potential of women. This seminar builds on the experiences she faced and explains the importance of gender sensitization in educational institutions to deal with various gender related issues. It also describes strategies to be adopted in schools to promote gender sensitization. This seminar will be useful to take a closer look at strengthening mechanisms which will ensure women's full and equal participation in decision making at all levels.

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 31/8/2018 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in ECE seminar hall at 10.30AM Dr. K.S. Reddy, Associate Professor,SNIT-Hyderabad.

was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure “GENDER SENSITIZATION FOR STRENGTHENING WOMEN PERSPECTIVE IN AGRICULTURE”.

Women have been contributing enormously to agricultural growth and development through their involvement in crop production, horticulture, animal husbandry, fisheries, natural resource management etc. Though the proportion of women workers in agriculture has declined, yet they constitute a significant workforce in agriculture. Globally, they constitute about 42% of economically active population in agriculture. Region-wise figures show that agriculture supports a very high proportion of economically active women, particularly in Asia and Africa and in India, it is about 62%. Women’s contribution varies across regions, sociocultural and agro-production systems. On the other hand, the persisting gender gap in access to and control of resources remains an important concern which has not only kept women in a vicious circle of low productivity but also has thrown up questions about inclusive and sustainable growth of the sector. Today, how to bridge the gender gap and empower women with new knowledge and technology is a great challenge, particularly in the context of socioeconomic and climate related

changes. Importantly, our approach to research, extension and development have not been gender sensitive and there is a general reluctance on part of a large section of researchers, extension and developmental workers to include gender component in programmes. While at global level there has been a lot of concern and action on empowerment of women in agriculture, efforts in India has been slow on this front.

Considering the above, the seminar on 'Gender Sensitisation for Strengthening Women Perspective in Agriculture' was organized to develop the competency of development and extension professionals in strengthening gender component in their development & extension programmes. The material was designed keeping in view the requirements of the participants with different backgrounds. The contents included issues related to women in agriculture in various domains of extension & Development, methodologies for strengthening gender perspective in interventions, gender and data analysis, monitoring and evaluation of gender based R&D projects. All these were compiled to develop this Compendium which, we hope, will be useful for agricultural R&D stakeholders.

She addressed particularly that the issues of women in agriculture for farm mechanization and to reduce their drudgery with increased output researches are carried with the aim to frame strategies for reducing drudgery of farm women to fabricate and disseminate the available drudgery reducing farm tools and equipment to stake holders. In order to demonstrate the output and utilities of gender research, strong partnerships with ICAR institutions, Gender Sensitisation for Strengthening Women Perspective in Agriculture, development agencies, NGOs and international organizations would be worked out in future. Efforts for gender mainstreaming are required to bring social, cultural and attitudinal changes which not only strive for ending the invisibility of women's contribution to agriculture, but of eliminating the drudgery that blights the lives of millions of working women in India. It is important to recognize that women's empowerment through technologies can raise their status only through a meaningful stimulation. There is therefore, needed to have the participation of women at every level in decision making, program formulation and implementation.

Charitra’ which means character is the most delicate and sensitive aspect of women’s dignity or self worth. Unfortunately, the same is at a high risk these days because of external threat as well as internal weakness which might lead one to become promiscuous. And in such cases, not just the woman but her whole family suffers a big loss. Identifying the root cause of such downfall, DJJS Santulan designed a grooming workshop for women and girls in order to develop their personalities to the core of their existence, nourishing trans body aspects – mind, intellect and soul. As only by meeting ones complete existential personality can she overcome behavioral and emotional fluxes received from family, friends or workplace.

The workshop adopts a 3-tier methodology of understanding the cause, enhancing the capability and awakening the confidence with the participants to build their mental, intellectual as well as spiritual strengths so as to preserve their self worth. The 3-tier methodology:

1. Peer Pressure – The Cause

**REPORT FOR “GENDER-SENSITIZATION IN INDIAN SCIENCE -
CURRENT SCIENCE”**

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 29/9/2018 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in Rudra Memorial hall at 11.00AM.

Dr. Mohd. Ibrahim Associate Professor, Aurora group of Institutions was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on “GENDER-SENSITIZATION IN INDIAN SCIENCE - CURRENT SCIENCE”.

She expressed that the seminar states to identify the status of online science education resources with regard to gender-biased visual content. With regard to the professions and activities of the men and women in the online science resources more men than women were depicted in science professions and more women than men were depicted as teachers. They found that women were depicted as teachers twice as often as men in all textbooks they studied, including texts on science and on mathematics. Similarly to the profession outcomes, in activities, we found that there were more women than men performing the activity of teaching. However, the activity category ‘experiment’ was not significantly different in numbers of men and women. As for children, no significant differences between the number of boys and girls in any activity category in these resources have been found. Children, as opposed to adults, are thus presented in a gender balanced manner.

The present study shows no evidence of gender balance concerning adults in science and as scientists in online science education resources. Not only are men depicted more often than women in general in the studied resources, they are also depicted relatively more often in a science profession. Children, on the other hand, are depicted in a gender balanced manner with respect to types of activities, which is a positive sign and might help girls see themselves as

capable of doing science. However, the adults in pictures and videos may serve as role models, making it very important that those visuals are also gender balanced. Accordingly, we can conclude that there is already a gender imbalance in the visuals of science education resources for children at primary school level. The stereotyping of men in science and women in teaching is, thus, already present at this very early level of education. The earlier this imbalance is presented to children, the more impact it may have on them. At least for girls aged 5 to 7, stereotypes already affect their math test results. Therefore, gender stereotypes in science education resources should be counteracted.

In conclusion, we found that in the studied online science education resources, women and men are portrayed in stereotypic ways, with more men depicted with science professions and more women depicted as teachers. Even if this is a true reflection of the distribution of men and women in those professions, we should aim for a more balanced representation so girls and boys see examples of both female and male scientists. We believe that a more balanced view will help girls and boys to make their own decisions concerning their studies and professions rather than those decisions being influenced by gender stereotypes.

She expressed that Every human being holds thousands of attitudes, including those about family and friends, political figures, abortion rights, terrorism, preferences for music, and much more. Each of our attitudes has its own unique characteristics, and no two attitudes come to us or influence us in quite the same way. Research has found that some of our attitudes are inherited, at least in part, via genetic transmission from our parents. Other attitudes are learned mostly through direct and indirect experiences with the attitude objects. disgusted by cockroaches), whereas other attitudes—such as our preferences for different styles of music or art—are more individualized.

Moving beyond recognition that gender stereotyping is an obstacle to women's rights to meaningful progress in implementing human rights obligations to address harmful stereotypes and wrongful stereotyping will require all of us – treaty bodies, special procedures, States Parties, civil society, academics and many others – to give this issue the serious attention it deserves.

Stereotypical beliefs about gender, which rigidly characterize differences between sexes and appropriate gender roles, are pervasive in most societies. These deep-seated beliefs reflect the

society's expectations that individuals behave and make choices in accordance with their gender. Examples of gender stereotyped beliefs and how they are reflected in behaviors and attitudes abound. They can be expressed in parents choosing rigidly-gendered toys for their children or steering them (subtly or blatantly) toward certain educational and occupational choices that are deemed to be suitable for their gender. They can be expressed in social backlash against or disapproval of certain behaviors on the part of women, such as aggressiveness or ambition. To the extent that they are ingrained in a society and influence the actual choices and outcomes of individuals, these beliefs may in large part contribute to gender-achievement gaps as well as the underrepresentation of women in top executive positions and in leadership. As ample evidence suggests, such gender inequality, factually confirming and perpetuating traditional gender role beliefs, can be quite persistent. The formation of gender role beliefs and conforming behaviors and attitudes likely begin very early in childhood, and have a significant role in the development of cognitive and noncognitive skills. Through the intergenerational transmission of preferences and beliefs, families have the earliest, most direct impact on the development of children's cognitive and social development. The channels of such transmission could be outright didactic teaching or a more indirect influence via parenting styles (including the language used with the kids) and providing role models. Examples for the former would be iterating what girls should and should not do, and discouraging male-typed behavior (girls are taught to be more obedient, kind and sharing), and examples for the latter would be a family where household chores are females' responsibility and males have more say in important decisions. Intergenerational transmission in the family may have important implications for children's attitudes, behavior and outcomes. It has been documented that transmission of gender attitudes from mothers affects daughters' as well as daughter-in-laws' labor force participation and human capital.

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on 5/11/2018 for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal Dr.Y.Ellamraj in CSE seminar hall at 02.30PM.

Dr. A.K.D. Bhavani, Prof. , Chemistry Dept. Osmania University
, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on **"ROLE OF WOMEN IN POLITICS"**.

She expressed that the term 'political participation' has a very wide meaning. It is not only related to 'Right to Vote', but simultaneously relates to participation in: decision-making process, political activism, political consciousness, etc. Women in India participate in voting, run for public offices and political parties at lower levels more than men. Political activism and voting are the strongest areas of women's political participation. To combat gender inequality in politics, the Indian Government has instituted reservations for seats in local governments.

Women turnout during India's parliamentary general elections was 65.63%, compared to 67.09% turnout for men. India ranks 20th from the bottom in terms of representation of women in Parliament. Women have held the posts of president and prime minister in India, as well as chief ministers of various states. Indian voters have elected women to numerous state legislative assemblies and national parliament for many decades.

The Constitution of India establishes a parliamentary system of government, and guarantees its citizens the right to be elected, freedom of speech, freedom to assemble and form associations, and vote. The Constitution of India attempts to remove gender inequalities by banning discrimination based on sex and class, prohibiting human trafficking and forced labor, and reserving elected positions for women.

The Government of India directed state and local governments to promote equality by class and gender including equal pay and free legal aid, humane working conditions and maternity relief, rights to work and education, and raising the standard of living. Women were substantially involved in the Indian independence movement in the early 20th century and advocated for independence from Britain. Independence brought gender equality in the form of constitutional rights, but historically women's political participation has remained low.

Indian women are significantly involved at the grass roots level of activism. The Chipko movement that arose in the 1970s is one example of success among the women's movement in India, as women protested the deforestation in Uttarakhand leading to the protection of the region. Since the Indian independence, women's organizations have focused on issues of violence towards women. Women's movements have focused on rape, female mortality rates, female foeticide, dowry deaths, sati, and domestic abuse. Tragedies such as the Mathura rape case in 1972, the dowry death of Tarvinder Kaur in 1979, the death of Roop Kanwar by practice of sati in 1987, the gang rape of Bhanwari Devi in 1992, and the New Delhi gang rape case in 2012, have kept the movement focused on rape and given rise to many women's organizations at the local and national level.

Dr. N. Mangathayaru, Associate Professor, OU campus Hyderabad.
, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure on “**CULTURE AND SEX ROLE STEREOTYPES IN ADVERTISEMENTS**”.

She expressed that the Media is the most pervasive and one of the powerful tools in viewing and projecting product promotion related images and messages. Media insinuates its messages into our consciousness, many of which perpetuate unrealistic, stereotypical, and limit perceptions, e.g., women images. Gender stereotyping in media, where women are under-represented, that erroneously implies that men are the cultural standard and women are insignificant or indiscernible propagating patriarchic hegemonic ideology. Portrayal of women in media, across the globe, to sell various products to the consumers with a female face or images though the target users /consumers could be male or female both have been rampant leading to gender stereotyping. Women face or body images have been predominant factors to draw attention of the consumers to capture the market because such media imposition of gender stereotyping is believed to have an impact on individual and family decision-making and ultimately on the sales of consumer goods and services. Such gender based promotions of products are most common strategies practiced by advertisers to establish a strong connection with a brand. Through stereotyped representation of women, media distorts reality and reconfirms sex bias. Whether it

is prime-time television, in which there are atypical projection of women to sell or to promote a product/brand, right from a bathing soap, a detergent packet, rice or oil, cuisine spices where women has been projected the sole caretaker as homemakers and skilled with domesticity, or a model of car where women are supposed to sit back lazily on seat and the man drives on the road and grips the wheel projecting how inactive and passive they are in real- world, thus gender stereotype persists. As an offshoot of such stereotyping in virtual and visual world, the cultural predicament becomes more dominating on how a woman should present oneself even in reality. Constant distortion imposes and induces a belief that women have to suit to themselves and present them to certain level that is set by cultural standard and popular perception. Focus of the Present Paper: The present discussion is relevant and important in the context of Indian Market, where, gender stereotyping is an overt practice and considered as a norm to sell a product. Women as projected through various segmentation of product promotions (be it domestic items, apparel or luxury product) advertisements reinforced „women image” as domestic member, dependent on men, as sex-object or an ornamental gender who do not make important decisions, popularly as housewife (or a caring mother), and mostly portrayed as house bound whereas men are shown as decision maker and in a commanding role. Men are projected as expert primarily in work setting or as a voice of narrator in decision making in the house, economy and family matters. The present study examined the portrayal of women in Indian visual and print media. Using content analysis of advertisements that were examined from the editions of few popular magazines, like fashion journals like Femina, OUTLOOK, or popular Indian TV channels published/advertised during 2013-2014. The study focuses on various products and brands. It examines prevalence of female stereotyping in Indian media, where a woman across all ages stands as the best choice for brand promotion by advertisers and preferred by corporates. The present seminar also evaluates the influence of culturally prescribed sex roles on individuals' reactions to sex role characterizations in promotions, the gendering of products, and one's selfconcept (which purportedly underlies sex role stereotypic perceptions) towards gender.

she stressed that Academic Causes and sex equity, also referred to as "Equity in education", is a measure of achievement, fairness, and opportunity in education. The study of education equity is often linked with the study of excellence and equity.

Educational equity depends on two main factors. The first is fairness, which implies that factors specific to one's personal conditions should not interfere with the potential of academic success. The second important factor is inclusion, which refers to a comprehensive standard that applies to everyone in a certain education system. These two factors are closely related and depend on each other for an educational system's success.

The growing importance of education equity is based on the premise that an individual's level of education directly correlates to future quality of life. Therefore, an academic system that practices educational equity is a strong foundation of a society that is fair and thriving. However, inequity in education is challenging to avoid, and can be broken down into inequity due to socioeconomic standing, race, gender or disability. Educational equity is also based in the historical context of the location, people and structure. History shapes the outcome of individuals within the education system.

Gender equity in practicality refers to both male and female concerns, yet most of the gender bias is against women in the developing world. Gender discrimination in education has been very evident and underlying problem in many countries, especially in developing countries where cultural and societal stigma continue to hinder growth and prosperity for women. Global Campaign for Education (GCE) followed a survey called "Gender Discrimination in Violation of Rights of Women and Girls" states that one tenth of girls in primary school are 'unhappy' and this number increases to one fifth by the time they reach secondary schools. Some of the reasoning's that girls provided include harassment, restorations to freedom, and an inherent lack of opportunities, compared to boys. United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) understands Education as a " fundamental human right and essential for the exercise of all other human rights. It promotes individual freedom and empowerment and yields important development benefits.

UN Special Rapporteur Katarina Tomasevki developed the '4A' framework on the Right to Education. The '4A' framework encompasses availability, accessibility, acceptability and adaptability as fundamental to the institution of education. And yet girls in many underdeveloped countries are denied secondary education. Figure on the right shows the discrepancies in secondary education in the world. Countries such as Sudan, Somalia, Thailand and Afghanistan face the highest of inequity when it comes to gender bias

Gender-based inequity in education is not just a phenomenon in developing countries. A New York Times article highlighted how education systems, especially the public school system, tend to cause segregation between genders. Boys and girls are often taught with different approaches, which programs children to think they are different and deserve different treatment. However, studies show that boys and girls learn differently, and therefore should be taught differently. Boys learn better when they keep moving, while girls learn better sitting in one place with silence. Therefore—in this reasoning—segregating the genders *promotes* gender equity in education, as both boys and girls have optimized learning.

She expressed that What are the causes of sex differences and similarities in behavior? Some causes can be traced to human evolutionary history. especially the ways that the division of labor is influenced by biology and environments. A human universal--in all known societies--is a division of tasks so that men do some things in society and women do others. The specific activities in a society depend on what tasks can be performed most efficiently by each sex, given men's greater size, strength, and speed and women's bearing and nursing children.

The division of labor structures psychological sex differences and similarities. By observing the activities of women and men in their society, people form gender role beliefs or sex-typed expectations. For example, given that women perform more childcare than men in most industrialized societies, women are believed to be especially nurturant and caring. Given that men are more likely than women to hold higher status jobs in industrialized societies, men are believed to be especially dominant and assertive. Gender roles then influence behavior through social and biological processes. In social interaction, people respond more favorably to others who conform to gender role expectations. Women and men also might incorporate gender roles into their own personal identities. Additionally, hormonal processes support role performance.

Females enjoy a general advantage in communication skills, both in the verbal domain and in the production and decoding of nonverbal displays. The higher expressiveness of females is reflected in a higher frequency of both smiling and crying; gender differences in crying are especially robust and tend to increase in more gender egalitarian countries. Consistent with the data on personality and social relations males tend to use more assertive speech and interrupt their conversation partners. However gender differences in language use are highly dependent on contextual factors, testifying to the remarkable strategies flexibility of human communication.

She stressed particularly Education is a basic human right that should be exercised fully in all nations, but for many girls in India, attending school is not an option. A girl's education is an essential starting point in establishing equality everywhere. Despite the Indian Constitution guaranteeing equality before the law and non-discrimination on the basis of sex, India remains a patriarchal society.

Male inheritance and property ownership, early marriage, dowry, honor crimes, lack girls' education, which hunting, violence against women, and trafficking are all serious issues in the country. There are schools, but most girls do not attend, often because of religious reasons or cultural pressures.

The impact of education on girls is extraordinary. Education sustains human values. It forms the foundation for learning and critical thinking. Education also provides skills for girls to become more self-reliant and provides them with more opportunities. Thinking into the future, education also provides them with the knowledge to manage health problems.

A girl understanding her own body can make the difference between an unwanted pregnancy and an illegal abortion. Having the knowledge beforehand is crucial to saving and protecting lives.

The first reason why girls are pulled out of school is because of family responsibilities. Girls provide free labor at home for the family. Home is also where they learn to be a

better housewife. Many girls are kept at home because it is a better payoff than going to school. Having the girl attend school is not valuable to the whole family.

he family plays a central role in a girl's life and shaping her future. Respect is given to elders in all situations and no decision can be made without consulting an elder. This often leads to the practice of arranged marriages. The decision is entirely up to the family and the girl often does not even see her future husband until the day of the wedding. Compared to American norms, individuals growing up in India are much more dependent on their families, especially parents.

The second reason why girls are kept from receiving a primary education is because they are pulled out early to protect family honor. This also can affect the dowry when the girl is married. The boy's side of the family can raise the dowry if they suspect she has been in school with boys during puberty. The practice of dowry is illegal, but laws are not always implemented. If the dowry cannot be paid, the bride runs the risk of being ruined, or worse, being killed. Honor killings are prevalent among the poor.



REPORT FOR “SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY”

This seminar was organized by AVNIET on **22/2/2019** for faculty and students. The program was inaugurated by our esteemed principal **Dr.Y.Ellamraj** in ECE seminar hall at **02.30PM**

Dr. Nagaratna P.Hegde, Dept of CSE, M.Tech , P.hd,Vasavi College of Engineering, was an eminent speaker who gave clear exposure **“SEXUAL ORIENTATION AND GENDER IDENTITY”**

He expressed that Numerous controversies and debates have taken place throughout the history of psychopathology (and its main classification systems) with regards to sexual orientation and gender identity. These are still reflected on present reformulations of gender dysphoria in both the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual and the International Classification of Diseases, and in more or less subtle micro-aggressions experienced by lesbian, gay, bisexual and *trans* patients in mental health care.

It's a common misconception that gender identity and sexual orientation are connected. If someone is transgender, for example, many people automatically assume that they must also be gay. That, however, is not the case. Gender and sexuality are different, and it's an important distinction to understand.

Gender identity is defined by the Human Rights Campaign as the “innermost concept of self as male, female, a blend of both or neither – how individuals perceive themselves and what they

call themselves.” It can mirror what a person was assigned at birth, or be entirely different. There are dozens of genders, outside of just man or woman, that people can identify with.

Controversies and debates with regards to medical classification of sexual orientation and gender identity contribute to the reflection on the very concept of mental illness. The agreement that mental disorders cause subjective distress or are associated with impairment in social functioning was essential for the removal of “homosexuality” from the DSM in the 1970s. Moreover, (trans)gender diagnoses constitute a significant dividing line both within *trans* related activism and the health professionals’ communities. The discussion has taken place between two apposite positions: (1) trans(gender) diagnoses should be removed from health classifying systems, because they promote the pathologization and stigmatization of gender diversity and enhance the medical control of *trans* people’s identities and lives; and (2) trans(gender) diagnoses should be retained in order to ensure access to care, since health care systems rely on diagnoses to justify medical treatment – which many *trans* people need. In fact, *trans* people often describe experiences of severe distress and argue for the need for treatments and access to medical care, but at the same time reject the label of mental illness for themselves. Thus, it may be important to understand how the debate around (trans)diagnoses may be driven also by a history of undue gatekeeping and by stigma involving mental illness.

This seminar states that sexual orientation and gender identity have been viewed, in the history of the field of psychopathology, between two poles: gender transgression and gender variance/fluidity.

On the one hand, aligned with a position of “transgression” and/or “deviation from a norm,” people who today are described as LGBT were labeled as mentally ill. Inevitably, classification systems reflect the existing social attitudes and prejudices, as well as the historical and cultural contexts in which they were developed. In that, they often failed to differentiate between mental illness and socially non-conforming behavior or fluidity of gender expressions. This position and the historical roots of this discourse are still reflected in the practices of some clinicians, ranging from “conversion” therapies to micro-aggressions in the daily lives of LGBT people, including those experienced in the care by mental health professionals.

On the other hand, lined up with a position of gender variance and fluidity, changes in the diagnostic systems in the last few decades reflect a broader respect and value of the diversity of human sexuality and of gender expressions. This position recognizes that the discourse and practices coming from the (mental) health field may lead to changes in the broader cultural beliefs. As such, it also recognizes the power of medical classifications, health discourses and clinical practices in translating the responsibility of fighting discrimination and promoting LGBT people's well-being.

In conclusion, it seems crucial to emphasize the role of specific training and supervision in the development of clinical competence in the work with sexual minorities. Several authors have argued for the importance of continuous education and training of practitioners in individual and cultural diversity competences, across professional development. This is in line with APA's ethical guidelines, and it is even more relevant when we acknowledge the significant and recent changes in this field. Furthermore, it is founded on the very notion that LGBT competence assumes clinicians ought to be aware of their own personal values, attitudes and beliefs regarding human sexuality and gender diversity in order to provide appropriate care. These ethical concerns, however, have not been translated into training programs in medicine and psychology in a systematic manner in most European countries, and to the mainstreaming of LGBT issues in psychopathology.

SEXISM AND GENDER BIAS

The "glass ceiling" is a popular phrase that women have been striving to break through for decades. It refers to gender equality, primarily in the workforce, and great progress has been made over the years.

It is no longer uncommon for women to run businesses, even the biggest corporations, or hold job titles in the upper ranks of management. Many women also do jobs that are traditionally male-dominated.

For all the progress that has been made, sexism can still be found. It may be more subtle than it once was, but it makes an appearance in all parts of society, from education and the workforce to the media and politics.

THE POWER OF THE WOMEN'S VOTE

Women do not take the right to vote lightly. It can be surprising to learn that in recent elections, more American women have voted than men.

This includes seeking to establish equal opportunities for women in education and employment. Feminist movements have campaigned and continue to campaign for women's rights, including the right to vote, to hold public office, to work, to earn fair wages or equal pay, to own property, to receive education, to enter contracts, to have equal rights within marriage, and to have maternity leave. Feminists have also worked to promote bodily autonomy and integrity, and to protect women and girls from rape, sexual harassment, and domestic violence. Feminist campaigns are generally considered to be one of the main forces behind major historical societal changes for women's rights, particularly in the West, where they are near-universally credited with having achieved women's suffrage, gender neutrality in English, reproductive rights for women (including access to contraceptives and abortion), and the

right to enter into contracts and own property. Although feminist advocacy is, and has been, mainly focused on women's rights, some feminists, including bell hooks, argue for the inclusion of men's liberation within its aims because men are also harmed by traditional gender roles. Feminist theory, which emerged from feminist movements, aims to understand the nature of gender inequality by examining women's social roles and lived experience; it has developed theories in a variety of disciplines in order to respond to issues concerning gender. Numerous feminist movements and ideologies have developed over the years and represent different viewpoints and aims. Some forms of feminism have been criticized for taking into account only white, middle class, and educated perspectives. This criticism led to the creation of ethnically specific or multicultural forms of feminism, including black feminism and intersectional feminism.
